 IN REMEMBRANCE

John Nelson

Long-time DAPi member John Nelson passed away on Christmas Day, 2013. Members were saddened and shocked by his sudden death, especially since he had attended the annual Christmas party on December 17.

John had long been associated with Apple computers, and as far back as the 1980s he had an Apple IIe computer and was the club librarian for 5 ¼-inch floppy disks used in the old computers. He retained his active, although quiet, role as a librarian with various Apple clubs. He was shown as "Librarian" in the DAPi newsletter in 1995, so his continuous service for the Apple groups was well noted. John was the member who first set up the DAPi website, and later he was responsible for following the protocols for getting the monthly newsletter, *The Seed*, up and running on the website. He maintained his job as Asst. Webmaster until December 2013.



John will be remembered as sincere, well meaning, quite, and one who didn't need the limelight. At board meetings, he occasionally brought a cartoon to share, and he often told a joke to us after the meeting, starting with "Did you hear the one about...?" He was a proud veteran of the US Air Force.

FIXING STUFF

An article in Macworld suggests how you might use twist-ties to save power cables—before they fray. A step-by-step process is shown online. Here are the things you need to do it:

- The power brick or cable that you want to help protect
- 2 twist-ties
- [Cyanoacrylate](#)-based glue (like [Super Glue](#) or [Krazy Glue](#))
- A sheet of newspaper or plastic to place on your work surface
- About 15 minutes work time

However, after reading many comments about using twist ties, the following suggestions seemed even better: <http://www.sugru.com>. This sugru website has a short video made by the inventor—a gal in England named Jane Ni Dhulchaointigh. (sugru is an air-curing rubber.) She says: "While studying for my MA in Product Design (read 'playing and experimenting with materials') at the RCA in London, I had a bit of an idea. *I don't want to buy new stuff all the time. I want to hack the stuff I already have so it works better for me.*" The product, sugru, took a long time to develop from 2003 to 2010. In November 2010, it was listed in Time magazine as one of "The 50 best inventions of 2010." Note: The iPad was number 34, sugru was number 22.

CONTROLLING YOUR DAILY MAIL INBOX

So, is your inbox cluttered with old, read but not disposed of, "what'll I do with that?" emails? Christopher Breen of Macworld has a lengthy article on how you might clean up this hodgepodge in his December 2013 Mac 911 "Tips, tricks and solutions for your Mac Problems," at <http://www.macworld.com/article/2070700/how-to-slim-down-your-inbox.html>.

If you don't want to read Christopher Breen's 911 solutions, go to your own Mail menu, select Preferences, and then in the @ (Accounts) pane, select the account you are going to manage. Then click on Rules pane, click Add Rule, and follow the pop-up menus.

Note the circled question mark in the lower left corner of Figure 1. Click it to bring up a new window: "Add Rule settings," with step-by-step instructions. Use the Add Rule pane to create the conditions a message must meet for the rule to apply, and the actions to take when the rule is applied.

Note the circled question mark at the bottom of the "Add Rule Settings" page of Figure 2. Click on it to get: "Related Topics: Managing messages using rules." You can set up rules to filter incoming messages or reorganize messages you've already received. You can have

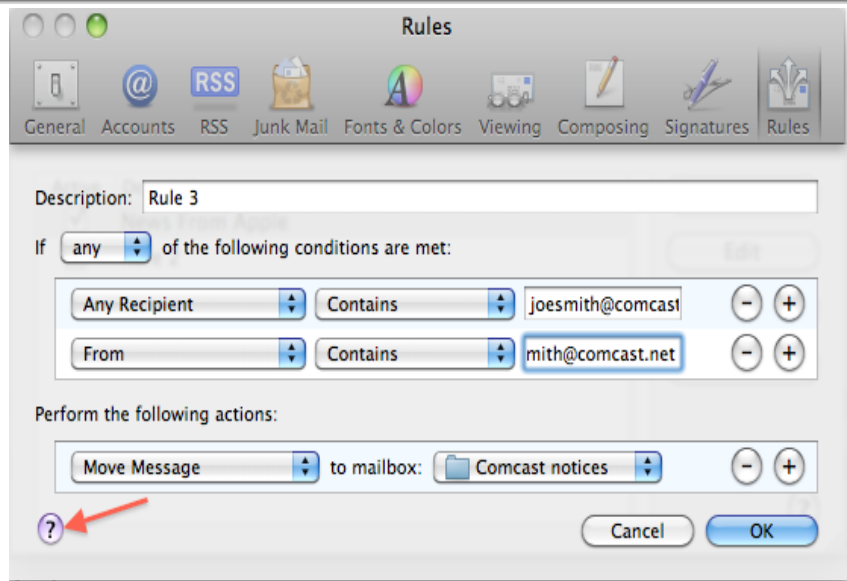

Mail automatically perform actions, such as file, forward, or highlight messages, based on conditions or criteria, such as the message's sender, recipients, subject, or content.

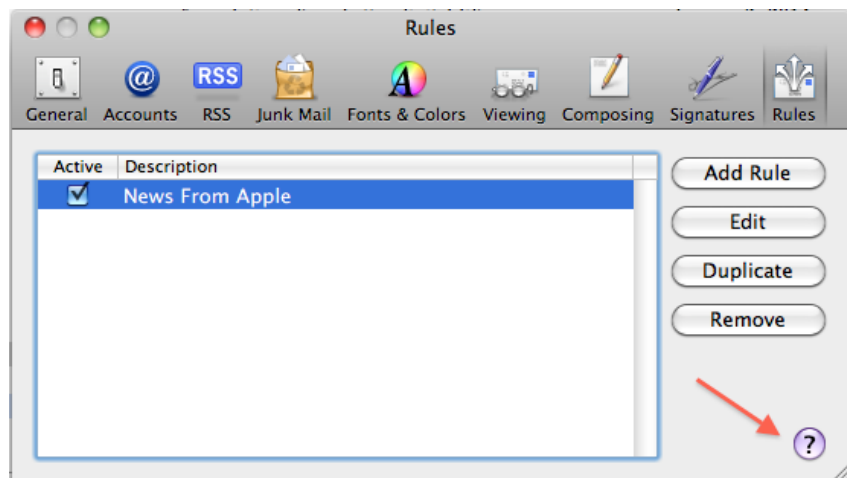
