YOSEMITE OS X®

OS X Yosemite is now installed on approximately 50 percent of Internet-connected Macs (as of 1/8/15), according to data from both <u>GoSquared</u> and Net Applications (via <u>Computerworld</u>). The free operating system reached the 50 percent adoption mark faster than any previous version of OS X.

Another factor is Apple's relatively minimal system requirements. OS X Yosemite can run on all Macs that supported OS X Mavericks, that is, all iMacs and MacBook Pros since 2007, MacBook Airs and Mac Pros since 2008, and Mac minis since 2009. Yosemite's rapid adoption numbers underscore the success of Apple's "free update" model that the company introduced with the launch of Mavericks.

Some other information to consider before upgrading:

- No indication of customer satisfaction.
- Rolling back to earlier version after upgrading requires a back-up and

more time than most people wish to spend.

- Security support for 2011's Lion and earlier versions has been discontinued which means that no vulnerability patches are available.
- OS X® Yosemite, the latest major release of the world's most advanced desktop operating system (October 16, 2014), is available as a free upgrade for Mac® users from the Mac App StoreSM.
- Yosemite supports all Macs introduced in 2009 or later, and some models introduced in 2007 and 2008. For a complete list of system requirements and compatible systems, please visit apple.com/osx/how-to-upgrade.

WRONG EMAIL ADDRESSES?

It's easy to change new email addresses in your Address Book. That doesn't mean that the old email address is gone from the memory. Mail "auto completes" the email address when you begin typing the addressee. If this happens and it's the wrong address, click the small down arrow in the recipient and select "Remove from Previous Recipients List" from the menu.

Another way to search for the unwanted address is to go into your Mail program, go to the menu bar at the top and click and hold on "Window," and then highlight and click on "Previous Recipients." You will note all the email addresses you've used. To find what you want to delete, type the name of the person in the spotlight window, then select the one you don't want and click on "Remove From List" located at bottom of page.
