iPAD AND iPHONE TIPS

To take a screen shot on either your iPhone or iPad, hold down the Home button and the Power button simultaneously. You can do this during a video or anything else that appears on the screen. After you "click" on your screen shot, you will know if it is successful if you see a flash and hear a camera shutter sound. The image will appear in the PHOTOS app (or iPhotos) in the CAMERA ROLL. To take a screen shot during a video, get prepared and click quickly because the video or action shot won't wait for you to get ready.



When might you want a screen shot?

- A recipe from the internet that you'd like to keep without having to search for it again. You can read it later on your iPhone or iPad in your photos app, or you can mail it to yourself and print it out for later use.
- Screen shots of your device settings.
- Get a still photo of something or someone showing up in an online video or blog.

INK CARTRIDGE REPLACEMENT TRICKS



Recently I received an email (shown here) suggesting how to reset the button on the ink cartridge when the computer says you're out of ink. My printer has warned me I need to replace the cartridge, but I

always wait until it will not print anything before I replace the cartridge. FYI. I just tried this on my own Epson printer which uses #79 cartridges, and there was no replacement button and it did not work, so I replaced the cartridge.

The paperclip method may work on some Epson inkjet printers. The website below suggests that non-Epson printers may not and suggests some other methods for other printers. http://www.inkpal.com/ink-news/print-without-color-ink/

On some laser printers, one can "override" the warning and continue printing by looking up "override" in the manual that comes with the printer. The "override" instructions on my color laser printer were found on Page 95— but it was there and I continued to print several hundred more pages before it

finally said "that's it, no more printing until you replace toner cartridge." Likely the best way to find this instruction is to Google "Printer Override Instructions for your printer model number" and you should find some good steps to follow to continue printing and not wasting ink/toner that is still available in the cartridges. http://pu5h.info/article/rese t-brother-hl-2240-aftertoner-refill

UPDATED APPLE CARE+
PROTECTION PLAN FOR
IPHONE, IPAD, IPOD AND

*WATCH

Apple has updated the terms of its AppleCare+ Protection Plan for iPhone, iPad, iPod and Apple Watch to cover batteries that retain less than 80% of their original capacity within the extended warranty period, whereas it previously covered batteries that retained less than 50% of their original capacity. The change applies to AppleCare+ purchased for iPhone, iPad, iPod and all Apple Watch models on April 10, 2015 or later.

"If during the Plan Term, you submit a valid claim by notifying Apple that (i) a defect in materials and workmanship has arisen in the Covered Equipment, or (ii) the capacity of the Covered Equipment's battery to hold an electrical charge is less than eighty percent (80%) of its original specifications, Apple will either (A) repair the defect at no charge, using new parts or parts that are equivalent to new in performance and reliability, or (B) exchange the Covered Equipment, with a replacement product that is new or equivalent to new in performance and reliability."

Comments about additional costs for warranty on batteries designed to last 2.5-3 years.

Batteries are one of the few technologies that are rarely covered under warranty beyond a certain timeframe (typically 1 year), due to how lithium technology works. Batteries will always deplete, regardless of usage. All manufacturers and all companies deem them to be consumable items.


