CHECKING YOUR LAPTOP'S BATTERY

**PROBLEMS WITH YOUR iOS DEVICE? RESTORE ORIGINAL SETTINGS AND BEGIN ANEW**

If your iOS device is acting out of sorts, you may have a virus or maybe just some things are out of "alignment," or they're buggy. You may need to erase everything and start anew. Find out how to do this at the Apple Support website <https://support.apple.com/en-us/HT204686> for step-by-step instructions. The troubleshooting guidelines in summary are:

1. Back up your data before you erase.
2. Erase your device.
3. Set up your device as a new device, or restore your device from an iCloud backup or an iTunes backup.

If you're going to sell your device, learn how to clear the data from the device before getting rid of it.

FROM THE EDITOR*By Joyce Etherton*

Each month when I put *The Seed* together, it's always a question as to what you readers will be interested in. We have members using older operating systems, older computers, and some have current operating systems and brand new computers. Members use Macs, iMacs, MacBook Pros, MiniMacs, iPads, iPhones and likely some things I don't know about. We have varying tastes and needs.

Although few members make suggestions about what the newsletter should contain or even how it looks, I welcome suggestions, and I try to please or explain why it looks as it does.

Recently, someone suggested one column only because that person read *The Seed* on a small screen. Another member suggested columns of equal width. Another comment was that the embedded links didn't work. And then, another said they didn't like a "colored" background because when they print, they use up too much ink. Also, why is the document you receive online a PDF.

Here are some answers:

I personally like a document with columns. Using columns of unequal widths (and sometimes even full-page-width articles) allows me to insert photos, tables, screen shots, etc., into the wider column if that's what is needed. Sometimes, I don't need all that width to put in content.

Embedded links **do work** on my computer when I complete the document. I always check them to make sure they do work. Additionally, I make them links as well as giving you the URL that you can copy and paste into your browser. See the reason the for links not working below.

My word processing program is MS Word for Mac. I chose this years ago so I could exchange documents with my family members—they all use PCs. Then I became editor of *The Seed* and just continued what I was familiar enough with to edit this newsletter. Many DAPi members don't use MS Word and couldn't open the document if I sent it as a Word document—unless it was a PDF (portable document format).

Converting my original document to a PDF allows everyone to open it on their particular computer/OS. The content of PDF files isn't designed to be edited, *it's designed to display the same way on all computer systems*. But when I do convert my original document, SOME of the links aren't holding. The free PDF converter I use is called Adobe Reader. I have read on the internet that this free program cannot convert *some* hyperlinks. In these cases, the document contains blue text and underlines that signal links, but there are no operative links. Writers who use expensive programs such as Acrobat Pro or InDesign can convert to PDF format and not lose links.

So in your PDF copy of *The Seed*, if the links don't work, copy and paste the URL into your browser.
