Livestream to all iPhones, iPads, or iPod Touch devices running iOS 7.0 or later. Need to use the software's build-in Safari browser.

Mac users can watch by streaming it to Safari version 6.0.5 or later and running OS X version 10.8.5 or newer.

Apple is expected to announce the Watch 2, the iPhone 7 and iPhone 7 Plus. The iOS 10 GM download (the OS 10 Gold Master build for developers and beta testers) will be available and likely followed the following week by the release of iOS 10 for the public.

CONVERT OLD MEDIA INTO DVDs FOR \$25

Consider using a DVD to show your old media rather than a slide projector. Writing for Kim Komando.com, Ariyanna Norman suggests that Walmart's DVD transfer service has "customization options" that make Walmart's significant step above other companies and the price (\$24.96) is fairly standard among the providers. For nearly \$25 you can convert one video tape that's up to 2 hours in length, 100 feet of film, 165 images (slides or photos), 90 minutes of digital video or 540 digital images onto one DVD.

You can do it yourself using a DVD recorder and VCR recorder that Kim Komando has for sale in her shop.

HAVE YOU BEEN HACKED?

To see if you've been hacked or if your info is part of a data breach, go to these two Apple-user-friendly sites: have i been pwned? and BreachAlarm.

Have I Been Pwned? (HIBP): According to WikipediA, this website was launched in December 2013 and receives about ten thousand daily visitors and has 350,000 email subscribers.

Troy Hunt who has been running HIBP since 2013 writes on his website https://www.troyhunt.com/the-impact-of-have-i-been-pwned-on-data/ that HIBP has



exceeded his wildest expectations of what it might achieve. He says the website is impacting the market

price of breached data—downward! The following is quoted from his article on the impact of the website.

Identities are valuable. Email addresses, passwords, physical addresses and phone numbers to name but a few data attributes all pose value to criminal elements. They enable access to accounts well beyond just those breached thanks to both password reuse and weak verification processes (read Brian Krebs' piece last month on PayPal's lazy authentication* for a great example) plus of course provide malicious actors with essential elements required for identity theft. Whilst individual identities are valuable, full data breaches with potentially millions of identities can be a gold mine.

HIBP allows you to check to see if your account has been compromised in a data breach. You enter your email account and it quickly reveals if it has been "pwned."

After checking to see if your account has been breached, this website shows which website, e.g., Adobe, was breached and what data were compromised, e.g., email addresses, passwords, credit cards, etc. The website then suggests appropriate action such as changing passwords.

You can click on "notify me when I get pwned," and this window will confirm your request. You can add other addresses you have at this point. Also shown on this page are the "Top 10 Breaches," and by clicking another link you can view all breaches. The most breached website is MySpace with over 3.5 million accounts breached. You can

also donate to HIBP by clicking on an icon on the same page.

Breach Alarm will "find out if a password hack has exposed your password online." You can check your email address(es) immediately for free, activate email watchdog for free, or there are paid plans for this service.

EASIER AND BETTER PASSWORDS

Below is a link to a *Washington Post* video from August 11, 2016, about a newer way to create passwords we can actually remember. The solution is to type a several-word-long sentence that's familiar to you. To check the strength, type it into a search engine and see if the search engine completes it. If so, make it longer.

Guillaume Ross of security firm Rapid₇ tells clients to focus on password length for beefing up security rather than any other variable.

The new direction is one that champions less complexity in favor of length.

Still, the studies showed that even with passphrases throwing in a little complexity— a number, a special character— could only help.

DRY YOUR DEVICE IN A RICE BAGGIE

APPLE SPACESHIP CAMPUS VIDEO

The latest drone video, dated September 2, 2016, of Apple's second campus shows the nearly complete main building as well as landscape updates. As you remember, Steve Jobs envisioned this spaceship-like campus that is more than 1 mile around but broken up by cafes, lobbies and entrances with social interactions in mind. Included on the campus are miles of jogging and cycling trails along with 1000 bicycles kept on site for employees to travel around the campus. Underground parking for 8000 cars of the 12,000 employees is available so that the cars will not detract from the landscaping which is yet to come. More than 7000 trees of 300 different species including fruit trees will enhance the ambiance as well.

The project will be completed in 2016 with employees moving in in 2017.
