COMPUTERS CAN BE HACKED EVEN WHEN NOT CONNECTED TO THE INTERNET

DAPi member Andoni Lizardi forwarded an article from Quartz, a free online newsletter.

If you've ever wondered how hacking might be accomplished even if your computer isn't connected to the internet, look at this explanation and a graphic of how it's done. Quartz Author Keith Collins says, "...even when...extreme measures are taken, no computer is safe from motivated, well-resourced hackers." A piece of software called "Brutal Kangaroo" is designed to find its way onto air-gapped computers.

OPTIMIZING WEB BROWSERS

from Rocket Yard blog

Read how to tweak for increased performance common to all four browsers plus many tips for specific browsers. The big

four browsers are: Safari, Firefox, Opera and Google Chrome.



Author Tom Nelson identifies many ideas on enhancing performance from these browsers.

Comments are encouraged by him, and one registered reader suggests: A quicker way to clear caches, etc. in Safari is

- Command + Option+E for clearing the cache,
- Command+Option+R for bringing up the Safari Reset window, and
- Command+Comma to bring up Safari Preferences for Extensions, Cookie management, Javascript use, etc.

There is also a link in the article to Rocket Yard testing labs "Battle of the Mac Browsers," something they've done since the early days of the internet. Author Tom Nelson says he has been a "hacker" when that word still had good connotations, and now "we're going to resurrect the battle of the browsers one more time, and pit four of the leading Mac browsers against each other in a straight benchmark comparison. This battle is strictly a performance test."
