

GOOGLE IS NOW DEFAULT SEARCH ENGINE FOR SIRI ON iOS AND SPOTLIGHT FOR MAC

Apple has globally switched to Google as its default search provider for Siri on iOS Search and Spotlight for the Mac. So when you ask Siri a question for which she has to access the web, Google will be the search engine. This will be consistent across all Apple devices. *Except*—web image results will still come from Bing, but video results will now come from YouTube.

According to CNBC, "Google is paying Apple billions of dollars to remain the default search engine on iPhones and iPads." Estimates say Google will pay Apple \$3B in 2017, up from \$1B in 2014. These revenues


are nearly all profit for Apple and may account for 5% of Apple's profits in 2017. 50% of Google's mobile search revenue is from iOS devices. A mutually beneficial arrangement.

USE SPOTLIGHT (COMMAND + SPACEBAR) FOR QUICK ACCESS TO ALMOST EVERYTHING ON YOUR MAC Or you can click on the menu bar icon, but that's slower.

Spotlight Search
Spotlight is a
search tool, basically a text-based Siri, that
provides an instant search of every file on
your computer. For example, I typed Command + Spacebar and Spotlight opened.
Then I typed in "Paris Apple store" where I
had taken photos last year and this opened
immediately.



Note that a folder showing "Paris 2016 photos by jhe" is shown. The right column is the list showing photos I took that are on my computer in Photos. From the list I can select any one and open it in preview with a click. By the way, you can use the arrow keys (not the mouse) to select what you want to see, and then use Command + O to open the photo—never leaving your keyboard. When you want to look at something else, again open Spotlight and you'll see your previous search; just hit enter to look again at another photo, or type in another search request.

You can use Spotlight to check the weather and have several choices of weather sites that you may not have ever looked at before (they don't always agree, you know!). You can find sports scores as events are taking place—I checked the Rockies score online during the playoff game in Phoenix without watching the game.

So, if you want to look through your documents and can't remember what you named it, type in a significant phrase and hit enter (return) and see what you get! If you hit Command + Enter, it will open in Finder. And, if you really want to get fancy searching your files, use Boolean queries including OR, AND, and NOT. Also, Spotlight works best with Apple applications such as Mail, Messages, etc.

There are things Spotlight still *cannot* do. Spotlight can't search the Internet, though it can hook into Wikipedia, Fandango, Weather, and other pertinent information. In short: It isn't a true Siri replacement, but it can help you find quite a few things. If you can't

find it on Spotlight, give Siri a try. Her icon is up in the menu bar too. Click and voice your search request.

ARE YOUR APPS COMPATIBLE WITH MACOS HIGH SIERRA?

Jeff Gamet of The MacObserver online comments about which apps may (or may not) run if you upgrade to High Sierra For a short list of apps you may be concerned about, go to:

- Microsoft Office 2011 (need to update to version 15.35 or newer). Microsoft says no support for Mac users of Microsoft Office 2011 in High Sierra
- Cloud (Adobe isn't testing the Creative Suite versions of Photoshop, InDesign, Illustrator, and its other design apps for macOS High Sierra compatibility and warns CS4 users should expect issues. CS6 versions of Adobe's apps ran fine in TMO's tests, but occasionally crashed at inopportune times. Adobe Creative Cloud versions of the apps are supported as long as you stay current on updates—except for Illustrator. Adobe warned
- macOS beta testers that Illustrator wasn't designed to run on High Sierra. InDesign

users are experiencing cursor-related bugs, too. If you rely on Adobe's apps don't upgrade to macOS High Sierra until compatibility issues are worked out.

- **FileMaker Pro** (you need at least Filemaker Pro 14 to upgrade to macOS High Sierra)
- **1Password** (1Password 6 works just fine with High Sierra)
- Carbon Copy Cloner (upgrade to CCC 5 before upgrading)
- **Dropbox** (should work except for smart sync feature)
- **Evernote** (upgrade to 6.12.3 before upgrading)
- **Firefox** (upgrade to at least 55.0.3 before upgrading)
- **Google Chrome** (at least 60.0.3112.113 before upgrading)
- Roaring Apps Website (likely not working with High Sierra)

THIRD PARTY APP ACCESS VULNERABILITY FOR KEYCHAIN MACBREAK WEEKLY 577

A 3rd party developer for Apple software has discovered a vulnerability allowing 3rd party apps to access plain-text Keychain data on Mac computers. He noticed this some time ago, prior to High Sierra, and notified Apple, but they did not fix it. So he

has now publicly announced there is this vulnerability and let Apple take it from there. He has not shown the public how this access works and will not until after Apple has fixed the problem.

The Tech experts on MacBreak Weekly, Alex Lindsay, Andy Ihnatko, Jim Dalyrymple and Tanya Engst, discussed how the developer who discovered the vulnerability could have become extraordinarily wealthy if he were to sell this data to bad guys (or gals) where this vulnerability is in Keychain.

Keychain is a password management system in macOS developed by Apple. It was introduced with Mac OS 8.6, and has been included in all subsequent versions of Mac OS, including macOS. A Keychain can contain various types of data: passwords, private keys, certificates, and secure notes.



YOUTUBE KEYBOARD SHORTCUTS

These shortcuts are really handy when you are watching YouTube: pause, fast forward and rewind:

Pause and resume press "K" and to resume press "K" again

Fast forward by 5 seconds press "L" Rewind by 5 seconds press "J"

OR

Pause and resume press the space bar, and to resume, press again

Fast forward and rewind press right and left arrows Volume press up and down arrows

If you stop the video, you can navigate frame by frame with the "," and "." keys.

You can double tap on the left or right of your mobile screen to fast forward/rewind too.

Other shortcuts: In Safari, from your desktop, you can drop a PDF into the browser window to make it open. Also in your browser, tap the space bar for "page down." For "page up," hold shift and press space bar.
