Gary is the producer and host of MacMost, an Apple enthusiast Web site and video podcast that teaches people how to get the most from their Mac, iPad and iPhone.

CleverMedia publishes GameScene.com, a Web site containing the world's largest collection of original Internet games by one company. Gary has created more than 250 Web-based games over the last 15 years for GameScene, other CleverMedia sites, and many other companies. Many of these games are available as iOS apps.

Gary has published 20 books on the iPad, Macs, and programming. His book *My iPad* was the best-selling computer book of 2011. It is now in its fifth edition. His latest programming book is *ActionScript 3.0 Game Programming University*, 2nd edition.

Siri

Siri is coming to the Mac at last. It has been on the iPhone, the iPad, the Apple watch, and Apple TV for a while now. Apple has been testing it on the Mac for the last four years. It is being announced at the Worldwide Developers' Conference 2016 as part of OSX 10.12 in June. The WWDC is being held June 13 to June 17 in San Francisco.

Siri will let you do almost everything that you can do on the iPad and the iPhone — open apps, get answers to questions, send text messages, etc., according to *The Verge* (http://www.theverge.com/2016/6/8/11876308/apple-wwdc-2016-keynote-date-no-macbook-pro-rumors). It's not clear whether it will be very useful on the Mac, but we'll just have to wait and see.



Cyberattack Against Macs

Apple recently quickly blocked a cyberattack aimed at infecting Mac users with malware known as ransomware, which typically targets computers running Windows. Victims are asked to pay a ransom to get access to the decryption key to recover their files. Antivirus programs often do not catch ransomware because modifications made by attackers fool security software. The malware appears to also try to encrypt files on Time Machine. (Yikes!) Recently a Los Angeles hospital said it paid \$17K ransom, saying it was the quickest and easiest way to restore its systems.

Address Book / Contacts Tip

Click on a name in Address Book / Contacts and then hold down the Option key. All the groups that person is in will be highlighted on the group side. This works in Snow Leopard and El Capitán, so it probably works in everything in between.



Accessing MacWorld Magazine and Other Magazines through the Library's Web Site

MacWorld is now on line only. You can access the current copy as well as back copies through the Jefferson County library system. Here's how:

- 1. Go to jefferson.lib.co.us.
- 2. In the line across the top, click on Research.
- 3. In the column on the right, go to Research Databases > A–Z List.
- 4. Where the letters go across from left to right, pick Z, and it will take you to Zinio.
- Click on Zinio.
- 6. Put MacWorld in the search box.
- 7. When it comes up, double click on the magazine. Current and past issues will show up. Double click on an issue, and a box will come up for you to sign in with your password and e-mail or create a new account if you don't already have one. To create an account, you must enter your library card number.
- 8. From there, you can read the magazine's full content.

All the online magazines carried by the library can be accessed through Zinio.

iPhone Apps Targeted

This is shocking news! Apple has known for months that hackers can swap out your iPhone and iPad apps with malicious ones without your knowing. But Apple still hasn't done anything to fix it. Worse, when hackers get in, they can take over your entire phone, control it, and steal your personal information. Apple says that a patch is in the works, but end users have yet to see it. So until a patch becomes available, use caution when downloading apps to your device. You can also use a VPN to create an encrypted connection whenever you use a public Wi-Fi network.

Apple Pencil

You can draw and color and take notes with it. Cost: \$99. Apple Insider gives this account of the Apple pencil and what it can and can not do.

- You can open apps and links, scroll, and navigate.
- You can not access edge gestures like Notification Center or Control Center.
- You can type on the keyboard, enter a lockscreen password, and invoke Spotlight search.
- You can use third-party keyboards with it.
 They work fine too.
- Palm rejection works everywhere.
- You can charge your Apple Pencil with a regular lightning cable.
- You can trace through a piece of paper.
- But you cannot use the opposite end of the Apple Pencil as an eraser.
- Multifinger gestures don't work (obviously).
- Apple Pencil won't work with your older iPad or iPhone.
- Don't bother buying this \$100 accessory if you don't have an iPad Pro.
