ANTI WI-FI PAINT

Researchers at the University of Tokyo in Japan have created a special paint that can block out wireless signals. The paint, which

could cost as little at \$17 per kilogram, contains an aluminum-iron oxide which resonates at the same frequency as wi-fi – or other radio waves – meaning the airborne data is absorbed and blocked. While paints blocking lower frequencies have been available for some time, this new technology is the first absorb to frequencies transmitting as high as 100GHz (gigahertz). Signals carrying a larger amount of data - such as wireless internet - travel at a higher frequency than, for example, FM radio.

The paint has a number of interesting potential applications including: keeping wireless networks secure, blocking phone calls during movies, shielding hospital rooms from unwanted electromagnetic radiation, and making clothes that protect people from electromagnetic waves.

Tom King will be featuring this program at our November 17 meeting. Here is a preview of the features of PixelmatorTM.

A Macworld review of PixelmatorTM (Four-Mouse rating) states it is an exceptional example of an

affordable photo and image processing program. Rather than the hundreds of dollars required for the industry standards Adobe Photoshop and Indesign, Smith Micro has Pixelmator™ at a special offer it can download for either a digital download or CD at \$39. There is a 30-day no questions asked return guarantee. This application is not geared for professional users for image editing but offers novice/amateur an opportunity to have a go at editing without spending too much and with a shorter learning curve. On the website, Pixelator reviews compare ten 2009 image editing software product comparisons.

LASER PRINTERS USE LOTS OF ENERGY

The downside of laser printers is that they draw a lot of energy to heat the element. It is best that you do not leave it on all the time as you will notice an increase, all be it slight, in your electrical bill.

A discussion of this is shown at http://forum.desktopreview.com/showthread.php?t=233354
Here you can see that running an HD TV takes about 225 W full on brightness, while a Gaming PC takes 250 W. This printer for comparison uses 500 at idle (just plugged in keeping it warm) and 800 while in use.

The question now becomes, "how do you figure out how much electricity your devices use?" Enter the <u>Kill A Watt</u> (KAW). The KAW is used to measure how much electricity is consumed by anything that plugs into a standard outlet.

DICTIONARY CLEANER 1.5LETS YOU EDIT YOUR SPELL-CHECK DICTIONARIES

A convenient feature of Mac OS X is its built-in spell checker, used by most Apple programs and accessible to any developer who wants to include the feature in their software. For example, BBEdit provides a number of spelling features based on OS X's spell checker.


You can add words to OS X's built-in dictionaries (or, described more accurately, add words to a supplemental custom dictionary that OS X will also reference when checking spelling), by right-clicking on a flagged-asmisspelled word and choosing the option to learn that word. This is an especially useful feature if, like me, you frequently work with words—technical terms and the names of products, companies and people—that don't appear in most spelling dictionaries.

The problem, however, is that once you've added words to OS X's dictionary, there's no way to edit those additions. Perhaps you accidentally added an incorrect spelling, or maybe you just wanted to avoid a particular word being flagged during a particular article or project. Mac OS X simply doesn't provide an easy way to edit the dictionary. Similarly, there's no way to add a new word without typing it in a document or text field, spell-checking that text, and then adding the word once it's been flagged as misspelled.

Now, with <u>Dictionary Cleaner 1.5</u> you can view, add, delete spellings from your Mac OS X custom dictionary.

Features of Dictionary Cleaner include viewing, adding, and deleting spellings from your Mac OS X custom dictionary:

- Simple, easy to use interface to view, add, and delete your learned spellings
- Easy to find System Preferences pane

- The OS version of your computer, processor, memory, serial number, hard drive size (GB) and your optical drive (CD-ROM/CD-RW, etc.)
- Your account data from system preferences
- Your Apple ID
- Emergency contacts
- Internet data from your service provider
- Email
- Backups


