

WHICH NEW MAC IS FOR YOU?

Here are some general guidelines for:

MacBook – starting at \$999

- ➤ White plastic body w/built in Webcam
- ➤ 2.4Ghz Intel Core 2 Duo processor
- > 2GB Ram, 250GB hard drive
- ➤ 10-hour battery life
- ➤ Additional RAM or larger hard drive costs more

MacBook Pro – starting at \$1,199 to \$2,299

- ➤ Aluminum body w/built in Webcam
- > 13-, 15- and 17-inch models
- ➤ 4GB RAM, 250GB hard drive and upgrades in processor speed and drive size
- ➤ Good for video games and video editing, viewing online video, light photo editing for digital camera photos and camcorders
- > SD card reader and FireWire Port
- ➤ On 15-inch upgrades /Intel Core i5 in 2.4GHz or 2.53GHz, or
- ➤ 2.66GHz Intel Core i7 processor
- > Enough power to watch and edit HD video
- ➤ 17-inch screen has 2353GHz Intel Core i5 processor great for video and games

MacBook Air --- \$1,499 to \$1,799

- ➤ 13-inch model, light and thin
- ➤ 1.86GHz Intel Core 2 Duo, 120GH HD limited to 2GB of RAM or

- 2.13GHz Intel Core Duo, 128GB limited to 2GB of RAM
- No optical drive—no CDs or DVDs. Can borrow another computer's optical drive wirelessly, or purchase an external optical drive from Apple

iMac — all in one desktop starting at \$1,199 to \$1,999 —will satisfy most needs

- 21-inch \$1,199 has 500GB HD; 3.06GHz Intel Core 2 Duo, 4GB memory.
- ➤ 21-inch (\$1,499) and low-end 27-inch (\$1,699) have same processor, same memory, same 1TB hard drive, same improved graphics card. Screen size is the difference
- ➤ 27-inch model (\$1,999) is the high end with 2.66 GHz Intel Core i5 processor and better graphics card.

Mac mini — \$699

- No monitor, keyboard or mouse: these cost extra
- ➤ 2.4GHz Intel Core 2 Duo processor, 2GB RAM and 320GB HD
- HDMI port to connect to HDTV
- SD card reader to transfer media from digital cameras or camcorders

- 2. Make important data available to yourself using online backup service.
- 3. Set up remote access for email, remote Login. Leave computer on in case you do need remote access. Sleep mode even prevents remote access (disable sleep in Energy Saver pane of System Preferences) and turn off your Mac's display
- 4. Turn on an out-of-office notification
- 5. Change your voicemail message.
