### **IPADS SMUGGLED INTO CHINA**

Chinese housewives with no criminal records were recruited to smuggle the new 3G version of the iPad into the border city Shenzhen on the Chinese mainland across the border from Hong Kong. In early December 2010, fourteen women were caught carrying 88 iPads and 340 mobile phones into China that reportedly were worth \$143,000. One woman had 65 mobile phones around her waist and 20 more in her handbag. Reports are that each "mule" received \$30 per trip across the border. The 3-G iPads being smuggled access the internet were thru AT&T Inc.'s CELLULAR NETWORK. THE WI-FI-VERSIONS OF iPad are currently available in China.

These events may seem ironic—smuggling something made in China back into China—but further checking revealed most of the components for the 3G iPad were manufactured in other Asian countries. Andrew Rassweiler. Director & Principal Analyst, Teardown Services of iSuppli, reports the most expensive component in the iPad is its touch-sensitive, custommanufactured screen. South Korea-based LG Display (LPL), Samsung, and Japan's Epson supply the liquid-crystal display (LCD), according to iSuppli. Taiwan-based Wintek makes the glass overlay that detects the touch of a user's fingertips. The screen's special design makes it

about twice as expensive as the screens used in comparably sized netbook computers.

The cost to print is substantial but in a pilot program we are beginning to outfit the legislators with iPads and pushing the digest to them each day so that it is available to them immediately on the iPad and the state saves the printing costs. The calculated payback for the state is about 9 months!

# KEYSTROKES FOR CHANGING UPPER CASE TO LOWERCASE IN MS WORD

Oh, this is nice.

If you use MS Word and inadvertently hit the Caps Lock, don't delete the whole word or sentence. Instead, highlight the word (or sentence), Press Option + Command + C. The first click will change the typed words so that the no letter is capitalized; second click, the first letter of each word becomes capitalized; the third click reverts to the original all caps mode.

Even if you have to correct one or two letters from cap/lc and visa versa, it can be timesaving and it eliminates the hassle of retyping a long paragraph.

#### FLIP4MAC

This question was on an internet discussion page:

Q. [Person has a Macintosh computer and cannot view a Windows Photo Story.] My parents made a slideshow of my late grandmother with their windows machine using Windows Photo Story. I cannot view that file. What can I do?

A. According to the Windows Photo Story FAQ, all you need to view a Photo Story video file is a video player capable of playing a Windows Media Video File. To play those types of files on your Mac, download and install Flip4Mac. It's a player that integrates with Apple's native Quicktime player and enables you to play Windows Media files.

Once you install Flip4 Mac you should be good to go.

Flip4Mac WMV is a free collection of QuickTime components that lets you play WMV and Microsoft Silverlight files on your Mac, either through QuickTime Player or right in your browser. You can also pay to upgrade Flip4Mac for more advanced WMV features, such as importing, exporting, and creating encoding profiles

which integrate with other QuickTime applications like Final Cut Pro.

# QUICK RESPONSE (QRS) CODES

The QR code is a rapidly growing feature used by retailers, museums, and governmental groups to quickly and economically give detailed information to users of Smart Phones.

Using a Smart phone, a user can take a picture of the QR Code and get up-to-date information on whatever subject is near the QR. For example, Target stores are using these codes in their toy catalog so that shoppers can get more information instantly on a particular toy. Art galleries have QR codes so the visitor can get more information on sculptures and artwork. Some cities have QR codes alongside construction sites so citizens can learn what the project entails, how long it will be under construction, and how much it costs.

These QR codes have been in use in Japan for over a decade and are growing in popularity in the US. To view the information from the QR

code, you download free software from the internet. Providing information using the QR mode is extremely cost effective for retailers, etc.

QR code reader apps are available for the iPhone. On the Webware site,

http://news.cnet.com/qr-code-readers-for-iphone, Don Reisinger has reviewed several QR reader apps and suggests four are the best available for the iPhone.

- NeoReader simple and works with QR, Data Matrix and Aztec bar codes. Free download.
- Optiscan it's quick. You can save the data for later, and you can share with others. \$1.99.
- QR App does an adequate job although not the best. Simply scans and delivers the results. Free for trial use.
- QuickMark full featured, keeps history folder for future viewing. You can create your own QR codes to share data on your iPhone with other QR-code-reader users. Recommended by Google. \$0.99.

Yet another reason for you to get a smart phone.
