CHANGE BROWSER HOMEPAGE

Setting what page you see (Home Page) when you open your browser is an easy task, regardless of what Operating System or Browser you use. You can set any web page. Some people use their hometown newspaper. Others open to their ISP Web Mail.

Bill Dean uses refdesk.com as the Home on his iMac and yahoo.com on his iBook.

Go to Preferences:

- Safari (OS X): General. Type the URL (the www, etc.) in Home Page box. Close window.
- Firefox (OS X): Main. Type the URL (the www, etc.) in Home Page box. Close window.
- Internet Explorer (OS X and 9): Web Browser>Browser Display. Type the URL in Address. Click OK. Close Window.
- Netscape (OS X and 9): Appearance>Navigator. Type the URL in Location. Click OK. Close Window.

Some people like the browser to open with a blank page. Preferences in all these Browsers provide that choice. In Safari, You find a Pop-up Menu that provides four choices. When you have the Home Page Preferences set, quit the browser, then reopen it. It will open with the new Home Page.



MAKING SYMBOLS WITH YOUR KEYBOARD

You can use the keyboard to make special symbols in your Appleworks and Pages documents as well as in email:

- To make a bullet (•) use Option-8
- To make a check mark ($\sqrt{\ }$) use Option-V
- To make degree symbol (°), use Option-zero or Option, shift-8

Customize Icons

- Select the icon you wish to change
- Get Info: File Get Info or Command-I
- Select picure you want to use
- Get Info
- Click on icon. Copy



Download YouTube Videos Using Safari or Firefox

INTUIT TO DELIVER QUICKEN UPDATE FOR LION COMPATIBILITY SOMETIME IN 2012

When Apple announced the new OS 10.7 (Lion), users were also notified that certain software would no longer work including the popular personal finance software Quicken by Intuit. Earlier versions of Quicken for Mac were built for older PowerPC architecture. When new Intel-Based Macs arrived in 2006 Rosetta technology developed by Apple allowed users to continue using Quicken.

In June of 2011, after five years of offering Rosetta as a solution to allow users to keep running PowerPC applications on Intel-based machines, it is no surprise that Apple has finally made the move to discontinue support. Intuit responded they would not upgrade Quicken for the new Mac operating system.

In late December 2011, the accounting software company announced they will have a solution that makes Quicken 2007 (yes, 2007) for Mac "Lion-compatible" by early spring 2012.

The company has lost a lot of customers over the issue and much goodwill. The company has some more details about the update on its website, along with a link so customers can be notified when the new version ships.


It's even a bit more aggravating because Bill Campbell, the former CEO of Quicken parent company Intuit, is a member of the Apple Board of Directors.

STARRY NIGHT SCREENSAVER



Do you remember Berkeley Systems screensavers? They were extremely popular in years past, but then the company went away. It seems that someone out there has recreated the Starry Night screensaver. This software doesn't actually DO anything except allow you to see a city skyline with a sky ever filling with twinkling stars. If you wait long enough you might see an occasional meteorite or falling star. To install, simply drag to your desktop, double click and then allow it to install in your screensavers.

The new version for Mac has a "retro colors" (e.g., grayscale) mode as well as color, and tries to recreate the city landscape as it was originally despite huge changes in resolution and screen size since the original's introduction. For long-time Mac users, the screensaver may invoke a bygone era of early Macintosh's, pre-OS X systems and even the now-obsolete need for screensavers.

The free program is only 148 KB in size and requires an Intel Mac running OS X 10.5 or later. It is available via MacUpdate (no developer website

available). Despite the similar name, the screensaver has nothing to do with the well-known painting by Vincent Van Gogh.

Truth be told, the necessity of the screensaver is behind us. Since CRT monitors have gone the way of the 12-inch Powerbook, most people don't need to worry about screen burn. Yet we still love screensavers.

Requirements:

Intel, Mac OS X 10.5 or later

SANITIZING YOUR MAC KEYBOARD AND MOUSE

In order to properly disinfect these areas, you should use Lysol Wipes or Clorox Kitchen Disinfecting wipes and follow the general rules below when disinfecting your Apple product. Note: Do not use excessively damp cleaning wipes. You may need to squeeze the wipe to remove excess dampness. Clorox Kitchen Disinfecting wipes are made with a bleach-free formula.

Do's

- Be sure to turn off your Mac, unplug the power cord from the wall or power strip, and remove the battery from portables or wireless keyboards and mice, before you start the cleaning process.
- Use a disinfectant wipe to wipe the area first, then use a damp, soft, lint-free cloth, and finally dry the area with another soft, lint-free cloth

Don'ts

- Do not use disinfectant wipes *containing bleach or disinfectant sprays* in general.
- Do not use an extremely damp disinfectant wipe to clean the area. If you encounter a very damp wipe it may need to be squeezed to remove some of the excess liquid before use.
- Do not allow the liquid from the disinfectant wipe to sit or pool on the area being disinfected for a long amount of time.
- Do not use rough towels or cloths to dry the area.
- Do not use excess force when disinfecting the area around the keyboard; this could damage the keys.

As always, wash your hands with soap and water and refrain from touching your mouth, nose and eyes.
