SAL KAHN AND THE KHAN ACADEMY

Cost: Free

The Khan Academy is a digital tutoring program from former hedge-fund manager Sal Khan. He initially made a few videos to help his niece through Algebra. Then he

expanded the site into a full-fledged tutoring service covering dozens of topics.

Sal Kahn is a fine presenter using the web for basic to advanced subjects from basic arithmetic to advanced subjects including trigonometry and organic chemistry. There are videos about real-world topics, too, such as the credit crisis or starting a business. Most presentations are by Sal himself, and there are over 4 million viewers per month, so he's doing something right! As you will see in the videos shown on YouTube from CBS 60 minutes, Bill Gates has become a financial supporter of this fine digital tutoring service. Take a look!

Currently, the site has almost 3,000 video lessons which run about 15 minutes each. Each video has a virtual blackboard that is easy to follow. Khan's use of humor makes the videos easier for students to enjoy.

Khan Academy offers activities and pre-tests that can track your child's progress. The tracking methods allow students to win badges and points for improvement, adding even more fun to their studies.

WHERE’S MY FILE?

Sometimes you click “save,” and voilà—your document is saved, but where did it get saved to? Depending on your OS, there are probably several options to follow the path to your file’s location:

In the titlebar:

- Hold down Command (⌘) and click on file name, or
- Right click on file name, or
- Control click on file name.

As shown below, a menu will pop up displaying the folder structure of the file’s location. Choose one of the folders to open it in the Finder.



MAC FLASHBACK MALWARE: WHAT IT IS AND HOW TO GET RIDE OF IT : DATED APRIL 5, 2012

This is a bona fide threat to the Mac Platform. We have all known that some time sooner or later there would be attacks to the Mac OS, and this one is real. Please refer to the above link to see what it is, how to find out if your Mac has it, and how to remove it.

After you type in the code strings in the terminal, the commands will run automatically. If your system is clean the message “does not exist” will show after each of the three code strings.

This latest malware got around Apple's XProtect by executing its files through Java. Apple closed off the main entry point with a Java update on April 3. These Java fixes are available only to Mac OS X 10.6.8 and later. Earlier OS X operating systems are still vulnerable, OS 10.5 and before.

An earlier review (see link below) about Flashback OS X malware may put your mind at ease somewhat. The criminals who have written this malware have made two variants to get into Java disguised as an Adobe Flash Player. For a comparison, during this same time period, a two week period in October of 2011, there were 190 new and updated malware programs detected for Windows systems. We are told this malware is distributed mainly on underground websites. (Look up "underground websites" for a better understanding!!)

In the rare event that a system is found to be infected, the simplest method of removing the malware is to delete the program containing it and download it again. This will remove both the payload application and the alterations that cause it to be launched. Safari for OS X is readily available for download from [Apple's Web site](#) and Firefox is available from [Mozilla's Web site](#).

CNET advises Mac users to download software only from trusted sources. Also, update 3rd party add-on security updates as soon as you receive them.

The Personal Color Viewer® (PCV) is a fun, easy-to use interactive color visualization program that allows you to see how thousands of colors, color combinations, and specialty finishes will look in any room or exterior surface before you pick up a paintbrush.

An online version is available too without a download, but there are more options using this free download PCF shown above from the web that Benjamin Moore has authorized to make available for download for Macs and PCs.

PCV claims to be one of the most versatile and powerful color visualization programs available offering the following features:

- Choose from more than 50 new sample images
- Upload your own room images
- Search the virtual fan deck of thousands of colors
- Experiment with faux painting techniques
- Share projects by email
- Export projects to your desktop
- Work cross-platform PC and Mac



MACBOOK PROS AVAILABILITY

From the internet

“Multiple” authorized Apple resellers indicate “out of stock” on the 15-inch MacBook Pro, says the *AppleInsider* website. The website suggests that constraints on the resellers of certain Apple products indicates a product selldown before replacing them with significantly upgraded products.

Production of Ivory Bridge chips by Intel will be introduced in June 2012, and projections are that this means Apple will incorporate them into the upgraded Macs, including the iMac and MacBook Pros.

Also, *Economic Daily Times* of China reports that production of a new MacBook Pro is under

production at Foxconn and Quanta Computer and will be shipped in June 2012.

The new MacBook Pro is rumored to have an anti-glare retina display which is used on the new iPad using the 2048 x 1536, 3.1 million-pixel display. If true, this is a major improvement in the MacBook Pro viewing comfort without the highly-reflective viewing screen currently used.



APPLE SENIOR VICE PRESIDENT OF INDUSTRIAL DESIGN JONATHAN IVE —March 12, 2012

The man behind the iMac, MacBook Pro and MacBook Air, iPod, iPhone, iPod touch, and iPad (to name just a few) — has given a [rare interview](#) to the London Evening Standard. And while Ive doesn’t offer any trade secrets, or reveal what Apple has in its pipeline, the design virtuoso does provide some unique insight into the world’s most profitable electronics company.

“[M]ost of our competitors are interesting [*sic*] in doing something different, or want to appear new — I think those are completely the wrong goals,” says Ive. “A product has to be genuinely better. This requires real discipline, and that’s what drives us — a sincere, genuine appetite to do something that is better. Committees just don’t work, and it’s not about price, schedule or a bizarre marketing goal to appear different — they are corporate goals with scant regard for people who use the product.”
