In September 2012, Apple hired “famed hacker and former Microsoft employee Kristin Paget” to beef up OS X safeguards for malware attacks on Macs.

Commenting about her change of jobs in a tweet, Kristin Paget responded to a question about what her ideal job would be: “Building things, ideally security-focused hardware. I've done too much breaking of things, it's time to create for a change....”

**SUGGESTIONS FOR NOT GETTING HACKED**

Staff writer Mat Honan from *Wired*, a publication that provides in-depth coverage of current and future trends in technology, had his digital life destroyed. His Google account was deleted, Twitter account was broken into and used to write horrible messages, and his AppleID account was broken into and hackers erased all of the data on his iPhone, iPad and MacBook. And, he didn't have any data backed up on his MacBook, so he lost all the photos of his infant daughter.

There are more important questions right now than “Does your password include an uppercase letter or not?”

If you want to know how to avoid becoming the next Mat Honan, check out Threat Level's [great security tips here](#). A video gives visual instructions on developing a two-step authentication process to keep your Google account safe. Additional tips include:

1. Use SSL or a VPN with public WiFi
2. Use unique passwords

3. Use complex passwords for important accounts
4. Don't link accounts
5. Get creative with security questions
6. Back up your system
7. Encrypt and password-protect devices
8. Use single-use credit cards

With each of the tips, links are provided to give additional, useful information on how to implement the suggestions.

A hacker needs three pieces of information: your email address, a billing address and the last four digits of a credit card number to get into your iCloud account. Once supplied, Apple will issue a temporary password, and that password grants access to iCloud.

In September 2012, measures were taken to *temporarily* disallow passwords to be changed over the phone, it's unclear what final policy change will emerge.

In the meantime, though, this should make you think twice about the kind of passwords you use: if you don't have long, random strings in use, hackers will be able to nail you. As [Boing Boing puts it](#), yesterday's "password that would take millions of years to break" is this year's "password broken in an afternoon."

If you get a call from your credit card company saying your card has been compromised, tell them you'll

**call them back, and call the number on your credit card rather than speaking to whoever called you.**

If you get an official-looking email from your bank, credit union, or another company you do business with telling you to log in and review your account, be careful. **Even if it's legit, it's always safer to visit the business' web site by typing in the URL instead of clicking the link in the email.**

SSL (Secure Sockets Layer) is the standard security technology for establishing an encrypted link between a web server and a browser. This link ensures that all data passed between the web server and browsers remain private and integral. SSL is an industry standard and is used by millions of websites in the protection of their online transactions with their customers.



### **CONTROL iTUNES LIBRARY USING REMOTE APP**

Remote is an all-new free app from Apple that turns your iPhone, iPad, or iPod touch into a remote control so you can play your iTunes library and your Apple TV from anywhere in your home. You can manage your playlists and see what's coming up with the Up Next feature. If your Mac is sleeping, Remote wakes it up so you can access all your digital media on iTunes.

Requirements: Compatible with iPhone, iPod touch, and iPad. Requires IOS 5.0 or later, and is optimized for iPhone 5.

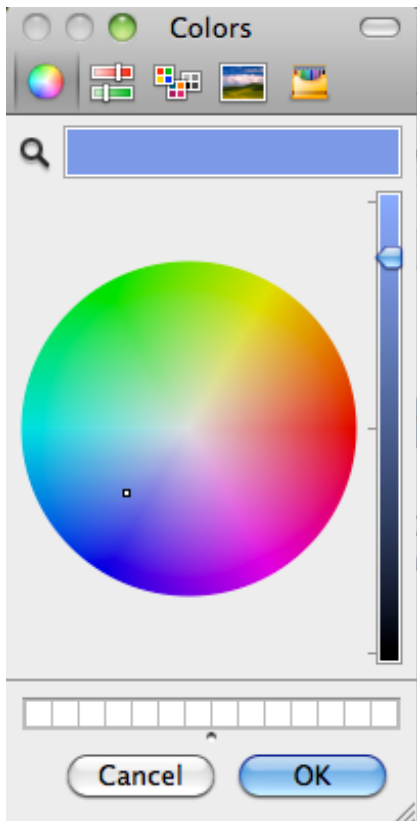

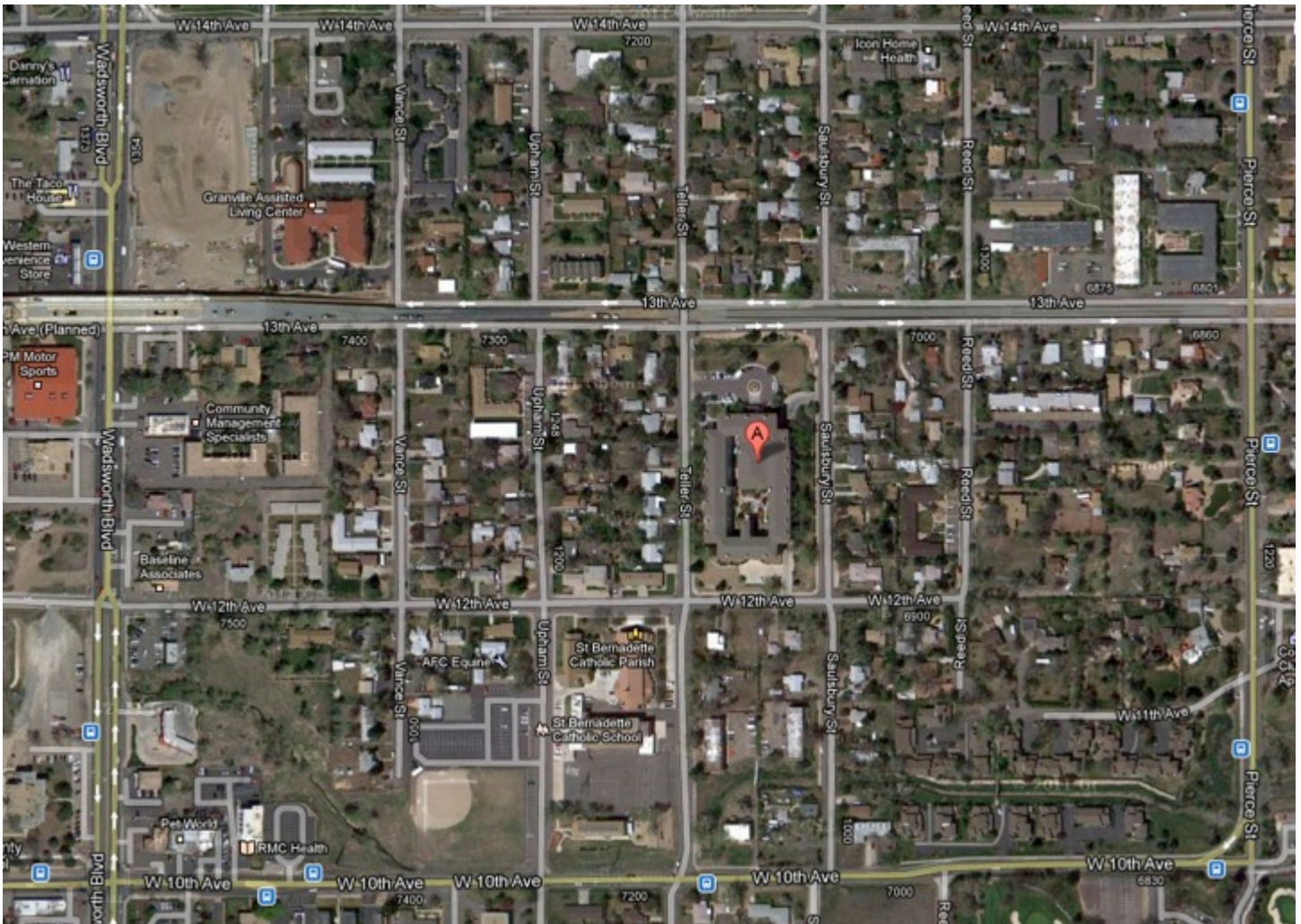
