1PASSWORD FOR iPhone, iPod TOUCH OR iPad

Requires iOS 6 or higher. \$49.99

Consider this highly-rated password app that saves your user names and passwords as well as miscellaneous information such as bank account numbers, licenses, and other information which you need but don't have memorized. The app stores all this data using an app that you access with just 1 password. This is the recently updated version 4.

Comments from users include:

Nextweb—a new feature called “Favorites” allows quick access to those accounts you use most often.

"1Password on the Mac and the iPhone is a hard combination to beat."

"1Password is *the* login info storage application on the Mac, and the iPhone version is no different."

1 Password Syncs safely and securely with [1Password for Mac](#) and [1Password for Windows](#) using free Dropbox service. The sync is two-way, so new information can be easily added on your mobile device and synced back to your Mac or PC

Gazelle is a 6-year-old company that says that developing countries are the greatest market for buying these older models of electronics. NEW KIDS' APP FOR IPAD

[Griffin Technologies](#) has developed a product called Crayola Light Marker for the iPad that will be available "soon." A marker-shaped pen enables users *to draw in the air in front of an iPad* and iPad's front-facing camera displays the strokes on the screen. Photos of the app make very colorful images on the iPad screen. Apps that support this new device are directed at child artists and include Dot to Dot, Paint Splatter, Coloring Pages, Puzzles, Hide and Seek and Free Draw. The Crayola Light Marker will sell for \$29.99 and the apps will be downloadable from the App Store. As user friendly as the iPad is for kids, this looks like a winner!

Griffin has also developed a combination lap desk and iPad cover called the Crayola Digital Activity Center that will make the iPad a convenient

tool for kids. The cover has unobstructed camera and dock connector openings for easy access. This too looks like a winner for the kids.

SHUTDOWN, SLEEP, OR LEAVE MAC TURNED ON

If you use the Mac every day, simply putting it to sleep when it’s not in use or overnight is probably the best choice. Just be sure to remember to reboot every once in a while to allow system software updates to install as part of a [general maintenance routine](#),

For the casual Mac user, it is probably best to put a Mac to sleep when it is not in use because it gives hard drives and fans a rest and will generally lead to a longer lifespan of the computer.

It used to be common to leave your Mac turned on because of OS X’s maintenance scripts that run overnight, but if you are running 10.4.3 or later, they now run at the next available time if you Mac is off or asleep when they are scheduled to run.
