ANOTHER OPTION KEY TIP






Fig. 1 Click on Wi-Fi icon in menu bar.

If you click on the Wi-Fi icon on the right side of the menu bar you'll normally just see a list of Wi-Fi hotspots (Fig. 1) that your computer recognizes. However, if you hold down the Option key while clicking the Wi-Fi icon (Fig. 2), you'll see additional technical information (outlined in red above) such as the encryption methods used:

PHY Mode: 802.11n. Wireless simultaneous dual-band networking

BSSID: Broadcast Service Set Identifier RSSI: Received Signal Strength Identifier

QUICK TIP: USE FACETIME ONLY FOR AUDIO

If you have a slow connection, or just want to talk to someone without the video part of FaceTime, you can simply hide the FaceTime app on your Mac (Command+H or FaceTime, Hide FaceTime). This will pause the video signal between you and the other party, but leave audio on. This uses less bandwidth and processing power. You can quickly switch back to video by unhiding the app.

ARE ADAPTERS INTERCHANGEABLE?

My new smartphone came with a cord and a USB power adapter. So my question at our last Help meeting was, "Can I use the same adapter for both my new iPhone5 and my old iPad2?" Jim Awalt, our DAPi VP of the Help meetings, noted that these adapters are different sizes for a reason. The larger-sized adapter for the iPad is rated to handle 2.1 amps while the

iPhone adapter is smaller and rated for 1 amp.

According to an online article in <u>Popular Mechanics</u> dated July 3, 2012, you can use them interchangeably and they will work and "nothing blows up." And the author Ben Goldstein says the iPad adapter seems to charge the phone a bit faster. Apple claims compatibility, so why not just go ahead and use the iPad adapter on both and be done with it? He suggests one should consider buying an extended two-year warranty for the iPhone to cover your cell two-year contract. Then, if your battery degrades severely after the first year, make Apple give you a new one. That's easy to say and if you enjoy dealing with the hassles of replacement, charge your iPhone any way you like. I'm going to charge mine with the cord/adapter that came with it.
