# iPhone \$29 Battery Replacements in 2018

If you own any of these iPhones—iPhone 6, iPhone 6 Plus, iPhone 6s, iPhone 6s Plus, and iPhone SE— in January 2018 Apple will offer replacement batteries for out-ofwarranty phones for a reduced price of \$29 (vs. \$79) without needing a device check. You must call your Genius Bar to get scheduled. The reduced price is also available at some third-party retailers and repair shops, as long as they are designated as an official Apple Authorized Service Provider. We are warned there may be a wait, so if your phone has been having slow-down problems as has been discussed in the news, call your local Apple Store Genius Bar to get scheduled. Batteries do deteriorate with age and usage, so decide whether you need a new battery. Apple says:

Early in 2018, we will issue an iOS software update with new features that give users more visibility into the health of their iPhone's battery, so they can see for themselves if its condition is affecting performance.


Using osX, you can make a screen recording without too much of a hassle on your Mac. You can record the

sound as well and you can even record your own voice explaining what you're viewing. The example given on *The Real Mac Genius* suggests you might even send a recording to your grandmother (who me?) explaining how to do great things on your computer. Or, as some grandsons are wont to do, record how you blast some intruder with your weapon of choice. Here are two ways to get to QuickTime and open your "New Screen Recording" screen.


- 1. Open QuickTime Player (Type Command+Spacebar, type QuickTime Player, and press Enter. Go to File in top menu bar and select "New Screen Recording."
- 2. Go to Finder, click on Applications in Sidebar. Locate QuickTime App in the list and double click on it.

Then on your desktop screen, select your photo or whatever you wish to make a recording of. Next, under QuickTime Player menu, select "File," and then select from

- New Movie Recording
- New Audio Recording
- New Screen Recording



Click on down arrow for microphone choices (see below). Then click the red button to begin your recording.



Select your choice

And finally, you will be given a choice to record the full screen, or to drag and outline part of the screen.



# "How Do I Force Pictures Taken with iPhone to Download to Photos on Desktop Mac?"

Gary Rosenzweig from MacMost gives instructions on how to download your photos from your iPhone. This may seem elementary until you have lost photos that are involved with iCloud.

- 1. Log into same iCloud account on both iPhone and Mac Make sure iCloud Photo Library is turned on in both.
- 2. Make sure your iPhone charged, plugged into power and connected to Wi-Fi. iPhone won't upload if it thinks you will

drain your battery too much or use your mobile data plan.

- 3. Check iCloud.com web site, log in with same iCloud account and check the Photos section. If you see pictures there, it means your iPhone is uploading fine and the problem is on the Mac end. If they aren't there, then the problem is with your iPhone.
- 4. Another thing to check is turn iCloud Photo Library off for problem device and then back on. Then wait for it all to sync. Or you can try to log out of iCloud completely on the problem device and then log back on again. Both of these trigger things to be checked and restarted, so either may help. The first is simpler as it only affects your photos, whereas the second is more extreme as it affects everything iCloud.

MELTDOWN –
THE LATEST
SECURITY
PROBLEMS FOR
OUR DEVICES

Spectre hits everyone, but Meltdown only hits Intel and ARM [chips] (used by Apple).

The latest security threats to our devices, including Macs, iPhones,



iPads and iTV, are named Spectre and Meltdown. Defined below are these bugs four different researcher groups around the world identified:

Meltdown—a gap in one of the most basic security defenses computers offer that isolate untrusted programs from accessing other processes on the computer or the deepest layers of the computer's operating system where its most sensitive secrets are kept. The feature they had exploited was introduced into Intel chips in the mid-1990s.

**Spectre**—leverages speculative execution to trick innocent programs or system processes on a computer into planting their secrets in the processor's cache, where they could be leaked out to a hacker performing a Meltdown-like timing attack.

So, what do we need to do to maintain our Apple device's security? And what happens

to older Mac operating systems that no longer are supported by Apple. Here are some familiar guidelines to follow:

- 1. Since exploiting many of these issues requires a malicious app to be loaded on your Mac or iOS device, download software only from trusted sources such as the App Store.
- 2. Use an updated web browser that contains relevant patches.
- 3. Firefox version 57 and later are apparently patched.
- 4. Google Chrome will apparently be patched on January 24 with version 64 or later.
- 5. Safari will apparently be patch in near future for Mac, iPhone, and iPad.
- 6. Install security updates and/or system software updates when available.

It isn't clear when or if Apple will issue security update patches for prior versions of Mac OS system software. Previously, Apple issued updates for the prior two system software releases, i.e., Mac OS X El Capital 10.11.6 and macOS Sierra 10.12.6. Some Mac OS users do not plan to upgrade to High Sierra likely because some previously installed software is not compatible with High Sierra.



### THE SHANGHAI APPLE STORE

The Shanghai Apple store shown here is in the district of high rises on the east bank of the Huangpu River, Lujiazui, China. The tall building directly behind it (the second tallest in the world) is the Shanghai Tower that opened in 2016. The tower is 2,073 feet tall and is second in height to the Burj Khalifa in Dubai at 2722.5 feet.
