GRAPHIC CONVERTER PRESENTATION BY LARRY FAGAN

Our DAPi meeting on February 20 was upstaged by a surprising amount of snow. Although only a few of us attended because of snow conditions that closed thoroughfares, Larry Fagan gave his presentation on

Graphic Converter and demonstrated among other things that, indeed, you can unskew a photo. To get a DVD of the presentation, call Elissa at 303.421.8714. Cost is \$1. YouTube has tutorials on "Graphic Converter for Mac." The developer, Thorsten Lemke, narrates some of the tutorials. MOVING IN TO APPLE PARK WAS A PANE (PAIN) FOR THREE WORKERS

Apple Park, including the glass-encased, ring-shaped spaceship, opened January 2018 for Apple employees. Steve Jobs, who envisioned this temple of design and died before the building was built, believed this building would be "the best office building in the world." A highlight of the building was the cafeteria with glass doors. Prior to the opening of this \$5 billion Apple headquarters, Santa Clara County Fire Department personnel were concerned about the visibility of the glass doors in the cafeteria. State Building code requires that doors be identifiable. During this discussion with one contractor, another construction worker walked into a glass wall. As a result, black rectangular stickers with rounded corners were placed on the glass panes in the cafeteria before building official Albert Salvador gave his Dec. 30 approval for Apple employees to begin moving into the main building.

In January during the first two days of move in, three men walked into the glass walls requiring incidents to be reported to 911

emergency services. Afterward, architect Norman Foster and Partners and Apple started putting rectangular stickers on other parts of the building and were effective in keeping people from running into glass. Birds flying into the central-wing glass windows has not been a problem, says Apple Vice President Dan Whisenhunt. Only humans have been victims to date. Apple stores have also added rectangular stickers to their glass walls to prevent inadvertent collisions. In the office areas, the "collaborative design" is broken up into pods separated by glass panes from floor to ceiling. Although office workers first put up sticky notes to prevent their bumping into walls. that was disallowed because they "didn't match the design" of the building said a Business Insider quote.

At a February 13, 2018, Apple shareholders meeting in the new Steve Jobs Theater, CEO Tim Cook said there will be no tours of the Apple HQ (the "starship") building because of confidential information inside. Only Apple employees with a badge are allowed inside.

Apple now is developing two medical clinics called "AC Wellness," one of which is inside the spaceship Apple Park Headquarters allowing Apple to take employee healthcare into its own hands. Apple states it will provide the "world's best health care experience" for its workers and already has several employees who previously worked for Stanford Health Care now providing health care in the AC Wellness clinics.

AMAZON CUSTOMER SERVICE NUMBER

There are about 90 million Amazon Prime users says a Kim Komando article dated March 2018. With this many users there are bound to be customer service questions. Finding a phone number for Customer Service could become a daylong event (maybe less). One can click on hundreds of links on the Amazon website without getting what you need and you still need to talk to someone. So write this down for your records: 1-888-280-4331.

If you were to use a search engine to find the Customer Service phone number, you might get a fraudulent phone number, and this could lead to providing your name, account number, etc., to a scammer. Since September 12, 2017, fifty fraudulent Amazon phone numbers have been listed (Source: TheDailyScam.com).

KEEPING UP WITH THE TIMES

If your emails sent from your iPhone or iPad end with "Sent from my iPhone (iPad)," you can delete this by going to Settings and scroll down to Mail. Tap the right arrow and scroll down to Composing where you will see "Signature." You can delete "Sent from my iPhone" there. Then return to Settings arrow and you choices are set.



1. Tap All Accounts at the top of the screen if you want to use the same email signature for all of the email

addresses tied to the Mail app. Tap Per Account to specify a different email signature for each of the accounts.

2. Type the desired email signature in the space provided or remove all the text to delete the email signature.

An internet Twitterer commented recently that anyone still using "Sent from my iPhone" shouldn't be allowed to own one. When iPhone was introduced by Steve Jobs in 2007, this salutation was included to signify the owner was one of the select few who had an Apple iPhone. Today, says the Twitterer, this is a sign of not keeping up with the times and now even Android users can and do say their email is sent from their Android device, so there is no more "sheen on your social status" to be gained by including "Sent from my iPhone" in your signature.

SELECT AND DRAG



Want to copy something from the web or from an email? Select it, drag it to new location and you're done. If you have the

TextEdit app in your dock, drag it directly to the icon. If you have a Pages document or another word processing document open, drag it directly to the open document. If no document is open, drag your selection to the desktop where it can be dragged to its new location whenever you want. You had better rename it on the desktop so you don't lose it. In other words, no more selecting, then copying, and then pasting it. You can also select and drag text to an open email.



RECOGNIZING INSECURE WEBSITES


Some examples of insecure websites:





The red arrow points to a circled "i" indicating an insecure connection despite the https:// at the beginning of the URL. Only connections to secure, encrypted https webpages are private, and those websites will show with a closed Green Lock.

A https://www. Security certificates are required to insure the website has been configured properly (see the "i" with a circle). When you go to a site that uses HTTPS (connection security), the website's server uses a certificate to prove the website's identity to browsers like Chrome, but anyone can create a certificate claiming to be whatever website they want. To help you stay safe on the web, Chrome (and other browsers) require websites to use certificates from trusted organizations.
