AIRBAG FOR YOUR iPhone

A German engineering student named Philip Frenzel has designed an "airbag" for your phone. He won an award from the German Mechatronics Society for his mobile airbag and expects to launch the device on Kickstarter, the world's largest funding platform for creative projects. This safety device will sense when the phone is in free fall and release metal prongs so protect it from damage. **GETTING A NEW COMPUTER?**

To go along with your magnificent new computer, or whatever device, you likely will need to get some new gear, including adaptors and likely a new hub. To make an informed decision on what you will need, watching this video

will help identify the myriad of technical data you need to consider before buying the adaptors, etc.

When Apple launched the new MacBook Pro in 2016, many of the familiar ports disappeared and were replaced by USB-C/Thunderbolt 3. Thunderbolt 3 uses the same connection as USB-C. If you happen to have "legacy ports and cables" (i.e., OLD), you will need to update.

The hub recommended by Matt Granger on YouTube (dated 6/20/2017) for at-home use is OWC's 12-Port Thunderbolt 3 model and sells for \$289 with one cable. If you need FireWire connectivity, get OSC's 13-port Thunderbolt 3 model for \$379. However, there are many hub options on the market, including a Belkin as used by Jeff Gamet at his recent DAPi presentation. For traveling purposes, smaller adaptors are needed. The YouTube video by Matt Granger evaluates the many options available for quality and design.

For a full explanation of the eligibility and purchase quantity limits, go to the Apple link above. Purchases can be made either online, in an Apple Retail Store, or through your Authorized Campus Reseller. Included in this list are:

Desktop: one may be purchased per year
 Mac mini: one may be purchased per year
 Notebook: one may be purchased per year
 iPad: three may be purchased per year
 Software: a maximum of two per software title may be purchased per year.

TIPS FOR iPad AND iPhone USERS:

On screen, swipe down from half way to get **search slot**. Then,

- Type in your airline flight number to find flight status.
- For measurement conversions such as inches to feet or Fahrenheit to Celsius, type in your question to see the answer.

In Notes, add a photo by tapping the plus sign. A pop-up menu will appear to offer:

- Scan documents
- Take Photo or Video
- Photo Library
- Add Sketch

Ask Siri to translate. Siri can translate English into Mandarin, French, German, Italian or Spanish. The phrase is printed and Siri speaks the phrase aloud to help with the pronunciation.



EMPTY OUT SPACE-HOGGING MAIL DOWNLOADS

Where Attachments Opened from Mac OS X Mail Are Stored

Emails with attachments, e.g., PDFs, ePub ebooks, documents, images, etc., can take up lots of space on your hard drive. A copy is placed in the "Mail Downloads" folder by default. To find that folder's common location and to find out how much space they take:

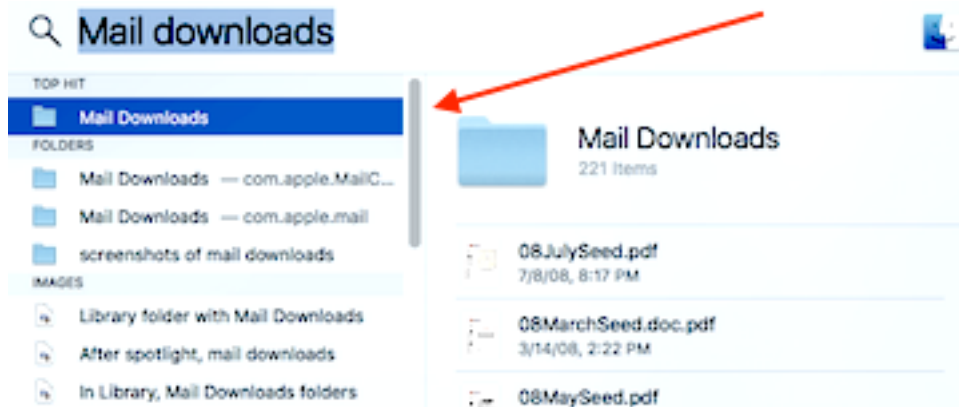


Figure 1 Mail Downloads from Spotlight

1. Using Spotlight (press Command-Space) type in Mail Downloads (Figure 1).

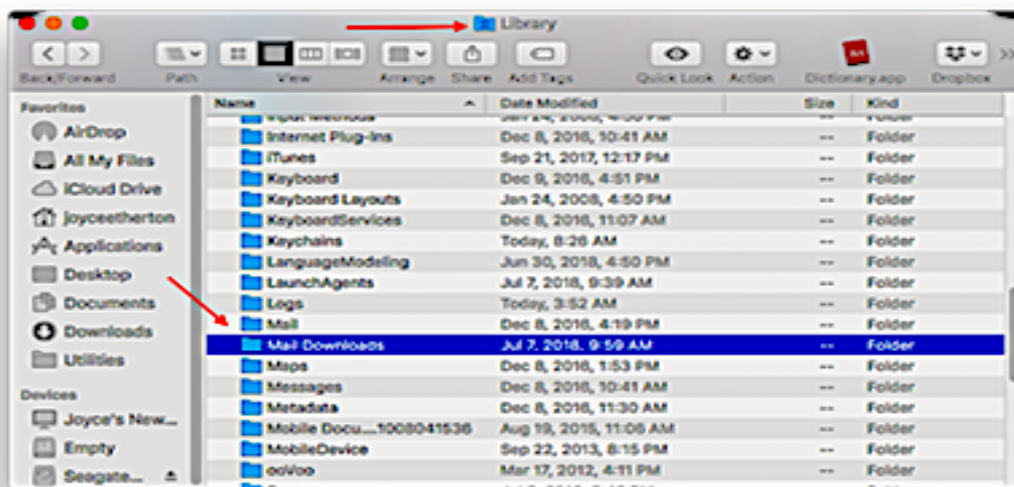
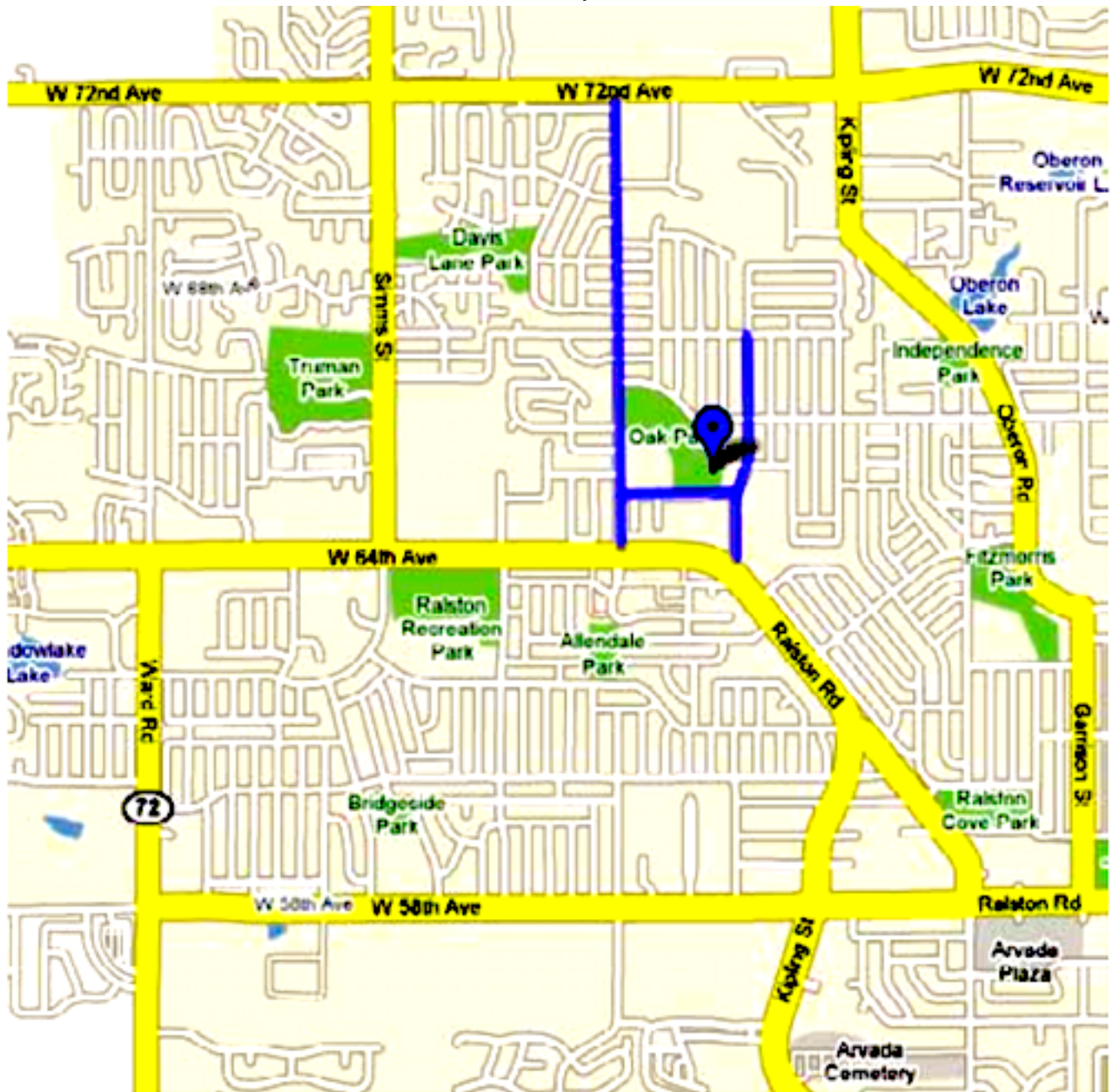


Figure 2 Mail Downloads folder in Library Window

2. In the **Finder**, press *Command>Shift>G* or select *Go > Go to Folder...*. In the text field, type: `~/Library/Containers/com.apple.mail/Data/Library/Mail Downloads` (Figure 2).

3. Once you get to the Mail Downloads folder in the Library window and open it, you can select all files and delete, or rescue the few files you want to keep awhile in a more permanent location—say, the regular old Downloads folder.
