In Remembrance

Robert Kinkel

1932 - 2018

Bob Kinkel died October 13, 2018. His wife said he died in the "Sangre [de Cristo] mountains that he loved."

Bob was an early member of DAPi when the club met at the Green Center at Colorado School of Mines in late 1970s. He was an active member and at one time served as a DAPi Board member. He continued his DAPi membership receiving his issues of *The Seed* by snail mail after he could no longer attend meetings in 2015.

Duvall Edward "Putter" Harvey January 29, 1930 – October 6, 2018

Putter was one of the early members of the DAPi club when we met at the Consolidated Mutual Water District Building on W 27th Avenue in Lakewood.

Putter was a Denver Native, attended schools in Colorado including University of Colorado Medical School. He served in USAF at the end of the Korean War. He joined his father's Obstetric and Gynecology practice and remained there as sole practitioner until retiring in 2004. He was on staff at St. Joseph's, Presbyterian/St. Luke's, and Rose Hospital where he was mentor to many new doctors over the years. He belonged to the Denver Country Club, Arlberg Club (a ski and social club founded by a group of Denverites interested in encouraging skiing and other winter sports), St. Joseph's Hospital Geezer Group and was a regular attendee of OLLI Courses. He is survived by his Wife Elaine "Pidgeon," and was a devoted grandfather to his five grandchildren.

JEFF GAMET LEAVES THEMACOBSERVER (TMO)

In November 2018, Jeff left his long-tenured job as Managing Editor of *TheMacObserver*. He announced his departure in TMO on November 2 with self-written article, "Jeff Gamet Leaving TMO, but it's OK to Smile."

A SHORT HISTORY OF THE "IPHONE" NAME

On January 9, 2007, Steve Jobs introduced iPhone at MacWorld as "a revolutionary product that will change everything," and it did. Prior to this announcement, the name "iPhone" wasn't Apple's name to use. Cisco said it obtained rights to the iPhone name through its 2000 acquisition of Infogear, which had a product line called iPhone.

According to the 2012 book "Inside Apple," by Adam Lashinsky, Steve Jobs tried to "work some charm" on Cisco executives to use the iPhone name, he offered nothing in

return—no licensing agreement, nothing. Cisco said, "No, we're planning on using it." Long story short: Cisco and Apple settled a dispute over rights to use the iPhone *name* prior to this January 2007 announcement. Under terms of the agreement, both companies have the right to use the name. Other terms of the agreement including rights to use the iPhone *trademark* were not disclosed.

APPLE'S NEW MACBOOK AIR, iPAD PRO AND MAC MINI

On October 30, 2018, Tim Cook and other Apple dignitaries introduced Apple's new MacBook Air, iPad Pro and Mac Mini. The presentation took place at Brooklyn Academy of Music in the Howard Gilman Opera House opulent beaux arts center that provides a "breathtaking first impression" on any audience.

MacBook Air Updates (after years of lying dormant) \$1,199

- 13.3 Retina Display 2050 x 1060 display (4 million pixels) 4 times previous model resolution
- 8th gen dual-core processors
- Up to 16GB RAM
- Thinner and weighs less too (only 2.75 pounds)
- 2 Thunderbolt 3 ports
- Touch ID built into keyboard for fingerprint logins
- T2 security chip
- Top-facing FaceTime camera

iPad Pro

 11-inch model (starts at \$799) and 12.9 model (starts at \$999—with keyboard and Apple Pencil \$1327) with Liquid Retina display options

- Thinner with slimmer bezels
- USB-C port
- A12X processor offering twice graphics performance from previous models
- Better AR quality (Augmented Reality)
- Up to 10 hours battery life
- Improved Apple 2 generation Pencil \$129
- Inductive/Magnetic charging for Apple Pencil (only way to charge Pencil 2)
- Apple's Face ID login for both portrait and landscape
- No more physical home button
- No more 3.5mm headphone jack

One can still purchase the older 10.5 model for "a bit cheaper" \$649.

Mac Mini – starts at \$799

- Quad-core 8th Gen Intel Processors, or upgrade to six-core Intel Core i7 processors
- 8 GB RAM and 128 GB storage or upgrade to 64GB of RAM and 2TB storage

iOS DEVICES

- Defined as "an electronic gadget" that uses a mobile operating system created and developed by Apple Inc. exclusively for its hardware, including iPhone, iPad and iPod Touch. iOS is the second most popular mobile operating system after Android. iOS does not include the Mac. That operating system is named MacOS.
- An iOS system is designed for use with Apple's multitouch devices using user gestures such as pinching, tapping and swiping. Also, iOS has gesture recogni-

tion that, for example, can undo the most recent action by shaking the device.


- Uses Bluetooth and Wi-Fi and cellular connectivity and VPN support
- Push email. Your email arrives on your iOS device because someone pushed it to you—you didn't have to request its delivery.
- Uses Safari mobile browser
- Front and rear-facing cameras with video capabilities
- Compatibility with Apple's cloud service—iCloud
- Siri—your voice-activated personal assistant
- Direct access to Apple App Store and the iTunes catalog of music, podcasts, TV shows and movies available to rent or purchase
- Cross-platform communication between Apple devices using Airdrop
- Apple Pay—device stores users' credit card data and allows you to pay for goods and services directly with an iOS device


