APPLE'S NEXT BIG KEYNOTE COULD TAKE PLACE ON MARCH 23, 2021

This next announcement may announce an updated iPad Pro, AirPods and Apple TV as well as the debut of AirTags, small tracking tiles with Bluetooth connectivity that can be used to find lost items. The March announcement isn't for certain, but those who watch Apple announcements closely predict March 23. The first prediction was March 16, but that was incorrect. This predicted date may not occur either, but Apple has these products in the supply chain. Stay tuned!

MALWARE DETECTED ON MACS WITH M1 AND INTEL CHIPS

As of February 21, 2021, Mashable says the piece of malware detected on 30,000 Macs "has no evidence yet of harmful payload," and security gurus can't quite pinpoint the malware's motives. Red Canary, a security operations firm where the malware was first discovered, named it "Silver Sparrow." Go to the Mashable link below (copy and paste) for the distribution methods used. Two

types of this malware are for Intel-powered Macs and the other is specifically for Apple's new M1 chipset. Apple has retracted the certificates of the developer accounts used to sign the packages so new Macs will not become infected.

Red Canary in conjunction with other security researchers from Malwarebytes and VMWare Carbon Black say "the malware might be used to deliver second-stage payloads to infected systems."

But *two* different types of malware detected in the three months since the new line's release is still a bit concerning.

The Malwarebytes website says, "Yes, Malwarebytes protects your Mac from Silver Sparrow."

APPLE GIVES "PRODUCT SKILLS" CLASSES

If you have purchased a new device from Apple recently, there is probably a class on how to navigate its capabilities. As of this writing, the classes referred to on a Kim Komando website will have expired by mid March 2021. However, in the writer's

opinion, the classes will likely be offered at a later date—virtually. The schedules that were shown were for

- Boulder, Twenty Ninth Street
- Broomfield, Flatiron Crossing
- Colorado Springs, The Promenade Shops at Briargate
- Denver, Cherry Creek
- Littleton, Aspen Grove
- Lone Tree, Park Meadows

Virtual sessions at the above locations were for the Mac, iPhone and iPad. To find out when a live session will be happening, head on over to the <u>Products Skills page</u> and enter your location. You have to hurry, though, as there are only limited spaces available "as a safety measure."

Here's how to sign up:

When you are on the Product Skills page, Click on the Choose a Location link.

- Input your state.
- Locate one of the several store options in your area.
- Select a store and click Apply.

If any sessions are coming up, they will be displayed on the page. Clicking on the Details link, you can get more information on the session. You can see what time it starts and what it is all about.

In the Getting Started with Mac session, you'll "Learn how to navigate your Mac, set up system preferences, and explore the latest

features of macOS. Whether you're brand new to Mac or just need a refresher, you'll discover the basics and a few of our favorite tips," Apple explains.

To join a session at your chosen time, click on the Sign up button. You might be asked to sign in with your Apple ID, and if there are still spaces available, you will get a notification that says, "you're in." Apple will send you an email with instructions on how to join and you can add it to your calendar

HOW TO TAKE A SCREENSHOT OF AN ENTIRE WEBPAGE ON YOUR iPHONE https://www.komando.com/smartphones-gadgets/screenshot-entire-webpage-iphone/778510/

Taking a screenshot of a single page that is visible on our Apple devices is something most of us can do. However, taking a screenshot of a multipage document is now possible. Kim Komando gives instructions:

- Open Safari browser.
- Go to the website that you want to capture.
- Take a screenshot like you normally would, by simultaneously pressing the side button and volume up (or on older phones with a home button, press the top button and the home button simultaneously).
- Once the preview snippet pops up in the lower left-hand corner, tap on it to edit.
- Above the image, you will see options for Screen and Full Page.
- The current view will be on Screen but tap Full Page.
- A preview of the entire page will be displayed.
- If you are satisfied, tap Done.
- This screenshot will be saved as a PDF-format file, not an image. You must choose a new location to save this item: in your phone's folders or in iCloud. After it has been saved you attach it in an email to share or sent it through a messaging service.



VERIZON TELLS USERS TO TURN OFF 5G TO SAVE BATTERY, REGRETS IT

In an effort to be helpful, Verizon accidentally stuck its foot in its mouth on Sunday (February 28, 2021), and then furiously backtracked.

5G phones require more bandwidth and more power. If your cell phone seems to have faster battery drain using your new 5G phone, Verizon told users: "Are you noticing that your battery life is draining faster than normal?" Verizon wrote in the tweet. "One way to help conserve battery life is to turn on LTE. Just go to Cellular > Cellular Data Options > Voice & Data and tap LTE."

With 5G, you get exponentially faster download and upload speeds—but do you really have 5G? It's complicated. Everything you need to know."

Other 5G providers including AT&T, T-Mobile and Huawei, have been dealing with this same situation but have handled it a bit more tactfully.

COVID-19 PASSPORTS? - NOT YET

New York City is testing the "Excelsior Pass" during events at Madison Square

Garden and Barclays Center. The Excelsior Pass uses secure technology to confirm if a person has gotten vaccinated or has had a recent negative COVID-19 exam result. It functions similar to a mobile boarding pass for air travel. Individuals can use an app or print out the pass to present at a venue. The pass is equipped with a secure QR code that is scanned to confirm whether the individual has been vaccinated or had a recent COVID-negative test.

Through the pilot program, participants voluntarily share their health status that's protected by encrypted technology. No other personal information or medical data is shared.

The European Union is conflicted over socalled passports for people vaccinated for COVID-19—might lead to discrimination, division. LA Times, March 3, 2021.
