
APPLE PENCIL TIPS

Tech Gear Talk guy shows how nicely Apple Pencils (both 1&2) can work on your iPad. This 8.21-video really shows how to many uses these pencils have. See which pencils work with which iPads:

This quick tips video is short and sweet! Many readers' comments confirm it is concise. Additionally, if you can't make the quick tip work and comment about it, James Contrast responds with a solution, as is shown in video about in last tip about tapping *very carefully* in the correct location to make it work.

- If iPad Pro screen is locked, take the Apple Pencil 2 and tap the black screen and the Notes App opens immediately.
- To take a screen shot, put Apple Pencil 2 in either left or right bottom corner and swipe up toward the middle of the screen and you have a screen shot. Additionally, you can tap the Notes icon and immediately mark up your screen shot. Then, you tap in upper left corner or your screen shot to save it to Photos. Then press Done and choose whether you want to save as PDF File or JPEG Photo
- If iPad is open in an app, to get to home screen without swiping up, just put Apple Pencil 2 as close to bottom right corner as possible and you get to your home screen. It helps if you're using an app where there is a brighter screen color.

YOU CAN PLAY CLASSIC GAMES ON YOUR MAC WITHOUT AN EMULATOR

The Internet Archive features web versions of many arcade and computer games for Mac, PC, Apple II, Commodore 64, and Atari in an online arcade. By "web versions," I mean that the games are meant to be played in a web browser. No emulator is required!

From using your iPhone without seeing the screen to adapting gestures to your physical needs, discover how the accessibility features built into your Apple devices can help you do more.

APPLE VERSUS EPIC GAMES FEDERAL TRIAL, MAY 2021 AND FLEECEWARE PROBLEMS

Apple will appear in a federal trial in May to fight game giant Epic Games after their brawl kicked off last August. Epic, the owner of the popular "Fortnite" game, introduced its own payment service into the app, skirting Apple's 30% cut from in-app purchases. In response, Apple and Google kicked Epic off its app stores, preventing customers from accessing "Fortnite." Epic sued both companies shortly after. However, As of April 10, 2021, Apple is reportedly refusing to testify at an upcoming congressional antitrust hearing as its App Store remains at the center of scrutiny.

Adding to the above concerns, Apple's App Store has a serious problem with fleeceware (new addition to the cyber-security jargon and describes apps engaging in a new form of online fraud--apps designed to trick money from users), a senior Apple engineer has been quoted admitting App Store security is grossly inadequate and leaves iPhone and iPad users dangerously exposed to scams and that this problem is far worse on iOS than Android.

Jagadeesh Chandraiah, Senior Threat Researcher at Sophos, has been looking into fleeceware apps since last year and recommends that device owners review their Google and Apple app subscription sections regularly to make sure they haven't been tricked into an unwanted subscription.

How to cancel subscriptions that you purchased with an app from the App Store on your iOS devices:

- Open the Settings app.
- Tap your name, and then tap Subscriptions.
- Tap the subscription that you want to manage.
- Choose a different subscription option, or tap Cancel Subscription. If you don't see Cancel Subscription, the subscription is already canceled and won't renew.
