SWYPE DON'T TYPE

For those of us not adept at typing with our thumbs on our iPhone or iPad keyboards, swyping not typing (or tapping) across the keyboard is a very useful method. It works on emails, notes and messaging. Additionally, the iOS' and iPadOS' machine learning and pattern recognition is really good at auto-completing and suggesting words in the QuickType bar based on what we are swiping on our keyboards. For folks that love this feature, the good news is that iOS 13+ and iPadOS automatically enable QuickPath. So swyping is on by default. So you only need to update to iOS13 and above and start swyping. See Swype Tip Basics* video. To write a word with double letters such as 'cool,' just make a loop or squiggle over the letter you wish to make two of and continue swyping the rest of the word**.

So, after trying the swype on my iPad Pro, it didn't work.... So I Googled the problem and Elizabeth Jones from AppleToolBox says, "Okay, a little more nonsense from Apple! They decided to only include the QuickPath slide-to-text feature on the iPad's **small, floating keyboard.**" So, to get the small, floating keyboard, squeeze with two fingers the large keyboard. To get the large

keyboard back, spread two fingers apart to get it back.

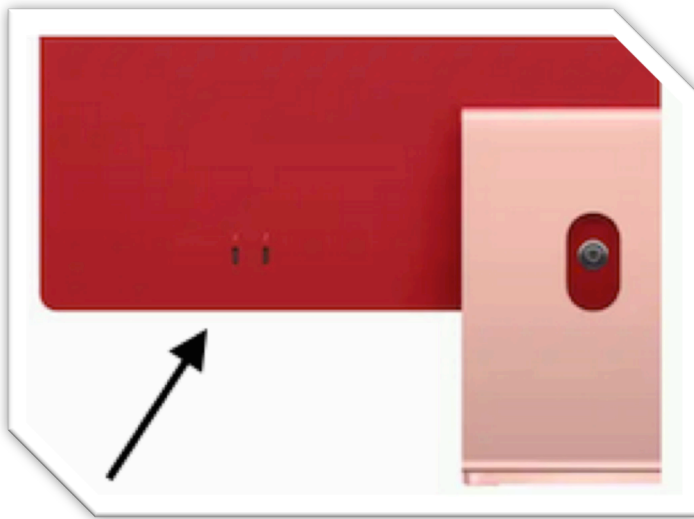

LOOKING AT SOME DIFFERENCES IN THE NEW M1 iMACS

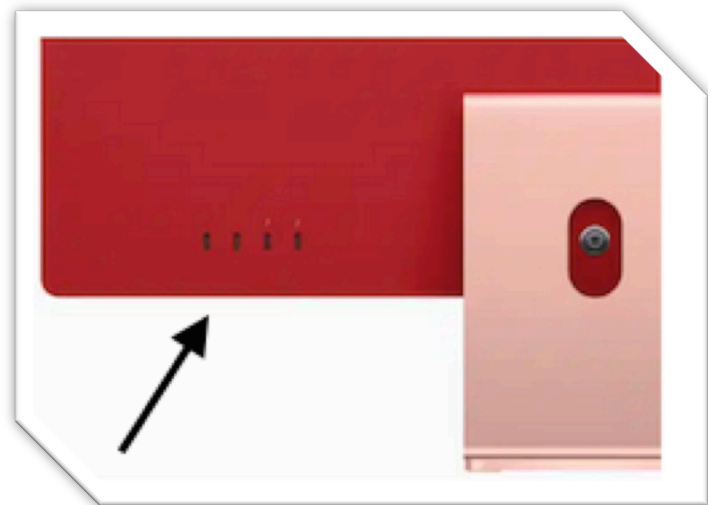


The \$1,299 M1 iMac has two Thunderbolt/USB 4 ports on back of display.

This new entry-level iMac with the M1 chip (same as in the Mac mini, [MacBook Pro](#), [MacBook Air](#) — and now [even the iPad Pro](#)) is a "crazy thin" desktop iMac with a *choice of three colors* (the more expensive models come in all 7 colors). These colors are a throwback to the early G-3 iMacs—remember them? Additionally, the power color-matched cable connector attaches magnetically matches the iMac, including the *INSIDE* of the cable where it attaches to the iMac. The power cable has two electronics components: the power adapter brick -- the chunky rectangle that you're familiar with from laptop power cords -- and an Ethernet network port in that brick. Be aware that there are Only two ports on back, but the headphone port is at the bottom left corner of display, much more convenient that on the back as it has been.

Each iMac model will come with a color-matched set of accessories, including a

Magic Mouse or Magic Trackpad with a colored aluminum base and a Magic Keyboard with a colored metal frame. The bezel framing around the display is white.



The \$1,499 and \$1,699 M1 iMacs have two Thunderbolt/USB 4 ports plus two USB-3 ports on back of display.

He says: "Obviously, if you are only connecting one or two items to your Mac, two ports will suffice. But two ports on a desktop machine are extremely limited, so you'll likely need to invest in a Thunderbolt hub, a device that is essentially a box that has several different ports on it, acting as an adapter for your devices. For example, we reviewed the Corsair TBT100 Thunderbolt 3 Dock (\$250), that you could connect to the iMac's Thunderbolt port, and it will then provide you with two USB-A ports, two USB-C ports, a gigabit ethernet connector, two HDMI video jacks, and an SD card slot. If you just need more USB-C ports, we love the OWC Thunderbolt Hub, which adds two extra Thunderbolt 4 ports and a USB-A port."



NEW MACBOOK PRO MODELS COMING THIS FALL

Rumors have been predicting the new, redesigned MacBook Pro models would be available later in 2021. Now Ming-Chi Kuo, analyst at TF International Securities who gathers his intelligence from Apple's supply chain and provides guidance to his clients, says the redesigned 14-inch and 16-inch MacBook Pro with mini-LED displays will be mass produced late in 3rd quarter (July to September) and launched in September. The redesigned MacBook Pro will feature additional ports, including HDMI and an SD-card slot, and removal of the Touch Bar. Although others have predicted this launch for months, Kuo's predictions have been more reliable and respected.
