## MAC OS MONTEREY UPGRADE AND PROBLEMS

MacOS Monterey 15.0, (released Monday, October 25, 2021) as the latest version of macOS, is bricking older Mac computers, rendering them unusable and unable to even turn on, according to a number of reports from users across social media and online forums. One report was for a 2020 MacBook Pro user, so not only older computers; this one is relatively new.

Users report problems with 2019 MacBook Pros, 2018 MacBook Pros, and 2017 iMacs. It's worth noting that the problem isn't universal.

MacRumors suggests users wait for MacOS 15.1 to give Apple time to fix this glitch.

UPDATE: Charlotte Henry in The MacObserver report on November 5, 2021 says Apple has addressed the problem and is "rolling out a fix to prevent this from happening in the future....We have identified and fixed an issue with the firmware on the Apple T2 security chip that prevented a very small number of users (which covers most Intel Macs released in or after 2018) from booting up their Mac after updating macOS. The updated firmware is now included with the existing macOS updates. Any users impacted by this issue can contact Apple Support for assistance. To prevent this problem from occurring to additional users, Apple has rolled out an updated version of the bridgeOS firmware that runs on the T2 security chip. Users already impacted by the problem are instructed to contact Apple Support for assistance."

## ANNUAL HACKING COMPETITIONS (WHITE HAT EVENTS)

## **American Hacking Contest**

CanSecWest Pwn2Own competition, held in Austin, Texas, is a computer hacking contest held annually at the CanSecWest security conference. First held in April 2007 in Vancouver, the contest is now held twice a year, most recently in April 2021. Contestants are challenged to exploit widely used software and mobile devices with previously unknown vulnerabilities.

This year's consumer-focused event was the largest ever with 58 total entries from 22 different contestants and required the contest to be extended to a fourth day. Schedule and live results are shown at

https://www.zerodayinitiative.com/blog/202 1/11/1/pwn2ownaustin. Shown results include the target of their hack, how they achieved their hack, and their prize money plus points for "Master of Pwn." This event was carefully scheduled and timed with predetermined methods, and not all hack attempts were successful "in the time allotted" The two largest reward prizes for a single event went to:

The Synacktiv (<u>@Synacktiv</u>) team targeting the Sonos One Speaker in the home automation category. **SUCCESS** - The Synacktiv team used a stack-based buffer over to compromise the Sonos One speaker and play us a tune. They earn \$60,000 and 6 Master of Pwn points.

Sam Thomas (<u>@ s n t</u>) from team Pentest Limited (<u>@pentestltd</u>) targeting the Samsung Galaxy S21 in the mobile phone category. SUCCESS - Sam used a three-bug chain to get code execution on the Sumsung Galaxy S21. This successful demonstration earns him \$50,000 and 5 Master of Pwn points.

Contestants could enter more than one event, and the grand winner was Synacktiv earning \$197,500 and 20 Master of Pwn points. DEVCORE was second with \$180,000 cash and 18 Master of Pwn points. Other contestants were winners but with significantly less money and Master of Pwn points.

## **Chinese Hacking Contest**

The Chinese held their annual hacking event called the Tianfu Cup in October 16-17, 2021.

Ethical hackers participated in this Tianfu Cup competition, an International Cyber

Security Contest, to see who could breach all major operating systems the fastest. Hackers were given three five-minute attempts to prove "the legitimacy of their attacks." The prize pool for the winning team was almost \$2 million.

Tianfu Cup is the Chinese version of Pwn2Own that was started in 2018 in N. America in the response to the Chinese government regulation that restricts cyber security researchers from competing in international hacking contests due to national security concerns.

In this two-day event, cyber security researchers won \$1.88 million in prize money. Among them, Kunlun Lab grabbed the top award of winning amount \$654,000 for performing successful exploits for the vulnerabilities in the iOS 15, remote code execution vulnerability in the mobile Safari within 15 seconds. - Adobe PDF Reader
- Parallels Desktop
- ASUS RT-AX56U Router

## SYNC YOUR **iPad** OR **iPHONE** USING FINDER IN MACOS CATALINA

If you use Mac OS Catalina and later (Big Sur or Monterey), to sync your iPhone or iPad you use Mac Finder, not iTunes.



Connect your iOS device to your computer to sync and the device will show in the Finder sidebar. From there, follow onscreen connections.

## APPLE CHRISTMAS "ORDER BY" DATES

On November 9, 2021, order deadlines for many Apple products are shown on the MacRumors website above. These orders placed with Apple show when you should order your device for delivery for Christmas. In some metro areas, in-store pickup at your Apple store may be available as well as two-hour courier delivery as late as December 24.

Custom configurations for Macs and some 14- and 16-inch MacBook Pro models are already backordered into 2022.

The list is inclusive for not only 2021 products, but also earlier devices including and iPhone 11. Check out the website above.

From personal experience, ordering devices for shipping and delivery may not be as expected.

- I ordered a device and was told it would be *shipped* on November 5, 2021. I received the device in the mail on October 15, 2021.
- Another package was to be delivered between November 15 to 23. It arrived and was delivered on November 5 when I wasn't home, was taken by UPS driver for re-delivery on November 8. It wasn't delivered on that day, so using the tracking information and then a phone call, I was told to go to a local pickup location, which I did.

So be aware that workers are probably doing their best, and sometimes it's not what the online information says.

Just once, I want a username and password prompt to say: "close enough."
