### iOS UPDATES – AUTOMATIC OR MANUAL OPTIONS

In "Settings" on your device(s), you have the choice of "Automatic Updates" or not. If you select to automatically update your operating system, the system will update when Apple sends it – which may not be immediately. However, if you don't choose Automatic Update and chose manual update instead, here are the Apple suggestions on how to do it manually.

- 1. Back up your device.
- 2. Plug your device into power and connect to the internet with WiFi.
- 3. Go to settings > General, then tap Software Update.
- 4. If you see two software update options, available, choose the one that you want to install.

Then, note the "Download and Install" link, click on it. It will take time to download, and it will take more time to install.

Apple's explanation of the delays in the rollout is not surprising. There are millions of iPhones worldwide and Apple needs the staggered rollout to protect its servers. But to learn that Apple also uses the delay as a window of opportunity to fix bugs on the updates before rolling them out to the majority of users is pretty interesting.

From an April 2022 report in *Forbes*, writer Kate O'Flaherty noted iPhone user Mateusz Buda wrote to Craig Federighi, Apple VP of Software Engineering, asking why his iPhone hadn't updated despite the fact he clicked "Automatic Updates" and noted that his iPhone hadn't updated immediately. O'Flaherty was "frustrated" because she is very security conscious and said she "needed to prioritize security upgrades."

In his reply, Federighi explained how the iPhone maker incrementally rolls out new iOS updates "by first making them available for *those that explicitly seek them out in* 

Settings, and then 1-4 weeks later (after we've received feedback on the update) ramp up to rolling out devices with autoupdate enabled."

In other words, according to Federighi, Apple likes to wait for any bugs to be reported and ironed out before pushing iOS updates to devices. There's another obvious reason—by ensuring everyone isn't updating their iPhones at once, it avoids overloading Apple's servers each time an iOS upgrade is issued.

#### **#** OR "COMMAND" KEY ON OUR MACS

Steve Jobs decided in 1984 that the Apple name and logo were being overused and thus diluting the brand. So he had Susan Kare devise a new symbol ## and called it the "command" key. Susan Kare was Apple's resident bitmap artist at the time.

This is how the iconic pretzel-shaped design was selected. Did you know this symbol is used in Nordic countries to indicate a campground on a map?

On our Macs, this key and others are modifier keys used in conjunction with keys as shortcuts, i.e., "Command-C" allows us to copy something, and "Command-V" allows us to paste what we just copied. There are multitudes of combinations to get symbols of all kinds.
