WAYS TO RETRIEVE WHAT YOU HAVE DELETED

Gary Rosenzweig has a comprehensive YouTube Video, "10 Ways To Recover Things You Have Deleted," that is worth your time!! There is more than one way achieve the action (I won't mention the feline idiom.) Below are some of the ways Gary has described but with video demonstrations.


Command Z - you can repeat this command several times to view several previous deletions.

Trash actually acts as a safety net. If you mistakenly delete something that goes into the trash, it's still there. You can drag your file onto the desktop to retrieve it. Not until you Empty The Trash is your document gone.

If you have a "Time Machine" backup, you can retrieve your file even after you have emptied the trash. If you saved different versions, they will appear in Time Machine individually, so you can see the various versions you wrote.

If you use iCloud Drive, you can see your deleted files by logging into your iCloud Drive and go to iCloud Settings, go to Advanced (at the bottom of the page), and select "Restore Files." iCloud will search for files to restore. There may be a time limit of how long iCloud Drive stores them.

In Photos, to retrieve photos you have deleted, go to All Photos and see the "Recently Deleted" trashcan. Select it, and drag your deleted photos out of it.




Emails you've deleted are likely still in the trash of whatever email you use be it gmail, hotmail, etc. Drag it out and place it in the Inbox to save it.

Apps can be deleted, and if you got them from the App Store, you can go back and reinstall the app with no additional charge. If you got it from a third party, you will have an account there showing that you have paid for it, and they should allow you to reinstall it at no charge.

LOCK SCREEN ON YOUR IPHONE

The Lock Screen, which shows the current time and date and your most recent notifications, appears when you turn on or wake iPhone. From the Lock Screen, you can see notifications, open Camera and Control Center, get information from your favorite apps at a glance. Access features and information from the Lock Screen.

THE NEW iPADOS 16 WILL HAVE WEATHER APP

When iPad OS 16 is released later this year, it will have its own real-time, free weather app, says Cult of Mac in a June 16, 2022 article. As it stands today, you can get many weather apps from third-party providers including Weather Bug and the Weather Channel. Weather reports in my area are identified on Weather Bug as being located at certain elementary schools fairly close to my home. Weather Bug is far more accurate than Weather Chanel for my purposes. On my Apple devices I receive weather notifications; seldom are they correct about rain. I trust the lightning strike notifications are accurate; the warnings tell me they are 10 miles away and for me to take cover. Maybe the new iPad OS 16 will provide better information and without ads.

GREAT ART EXPLAINED--VIEW MICHELANGELO'S DAVID ON YOUTUBE https://youtu.be/-e16DmKH01s

This 15-minute video narrated by James Payne is one of "Great Art Explained" excellent presentations on YouTube. The David, considered one of the most famous sculptures in the world, is in the Academia Gallery in Florence, Italy. Although initially planned by the city fathers of Florence to be placed outdoors, they decided it was so

important that they placed it indoors away from the damaging effects weather might cause. One of the city fathers of Florence objected to having the David sculpture placed in so prominent place. His name was Leonardo da Vinci, a contemporary artist and competitor of Michelangelo's.

Michelangelo completed David when he was 26 years old. His previous sculpture the Pieta, now in St. Peter's Basilica in Vatican City, was completed when he was age 24 and was the only sculpture he signed because he heard someone attribute it to another artist. His signature is carved as *MICHAELA[N]GELUS BONAROTUS FLORENTIN[US] FACIEBA[T]* "Michelangelo Buonarroti the Florentine did it". [7]
