**DID YOU KNOW?**

More than 1,000,000,000 (that's billion) hours of YouTube content is watched each day around the world, second only to Google searches.

On YouTube, you can view the story of the founders of YouTube and their movements thru college (and some dropping out but some continuing thru masters' degrees), going to several silicon valley startups and even to China before actually getting together to brainstorm on how to put videos made by anyone up on the web so others could view them.

After watching a video on the web called Hot or Not, a web dating site that charged \$6 per month to join and showed photos that could be rated by anyone who wanted to post something, the three founders, began work on this new format—YouTube!

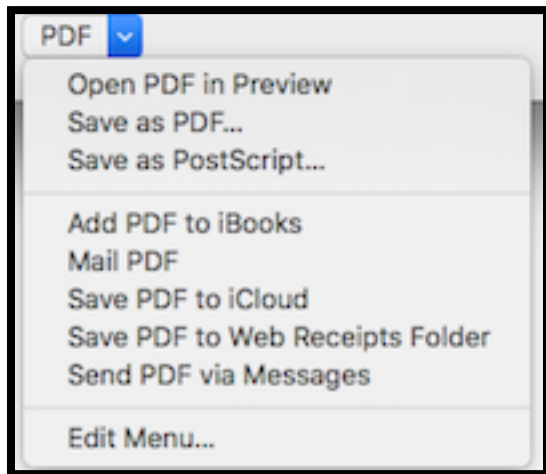
Watch the formation of the company unfold on the YouTube video, "The Dropouts Who Invented YouTube from a Rat-Infested Office." In 2005, Jawed Karim, Steve Chen and Chad Hurley, founded YouTube as one place to post and share videos. These men had different skills that combined to make an enormous company, YouTube which was purchased by Google in 2006 for \$1.65 billion in stock. At the time, YouTube was relatively small compared to what it is today. In May 2007, YouTube Partner Program was created to enable the video creators to make money from their videos.

Today, the founders Karim, Chen and Hurley are living low-profile lives after the incredible incubator days they endured. YouTube today contributes nearly 11% to the overall revenue to Alphabet's \$182 billion in revenue in 2020. YouTube has clearly been accelerating Alphabet's growth.

**YOU DON'T NEED ADOBE READER TO OPEN PDF FILES**

Gary Rozenzweig of MacMost has a nice video, "You Probably Don't Need Adobe Reader on Your Mac," explaining and showing that the built-in Mac "Preview" has the tools to easily open PDF files. Go to <https://macmost.com> and search for this video.

Gary shows all the things Preview can do rather than using Adobe Reader. Although Adobe Reader is free, Preview is a useful tool that already comes loaded on your Mac. If you get a PDF document, (as the issues of DAPi Seed are sent) using the Mac-provided Preview can be selected as the default when you click to open the PDF. Preview does all the basic functions that you need to read a PDF easily, and you can zoom in and out for easier viewing. You can also fill in PDF forms (those that are designed for filling in), and you can use tools to modify the PDF. Gary reminds us that you don't create PDFs in Adobe Reader or Preview. The PDF document is created in Pages, Microsoft Word, or others, and SAVED as a PDF.



## iPHONE CALENDAR TIPS

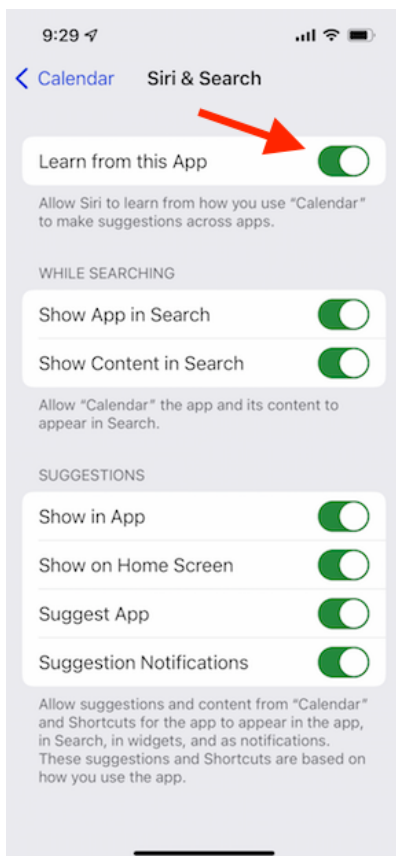
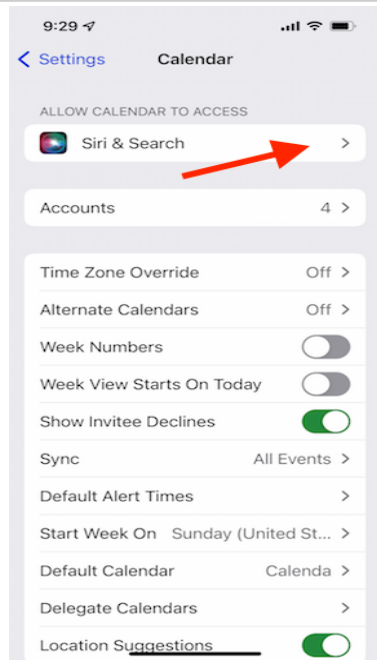
Proper Honest Tech on YouTube has a detailed video titled "Master the iPhone Calendar App with these Tips!" On this 11:25 minute video, at minute 2:35, he explains how you can ask Siri to help you with creating events. Here are some examples of what you can tell Siri to create, change, or view your events:

Begin your inquiry with, "Hey, Siri."

- Create a new event on Monday at 2 pm.
- Name it "team meeting."
- I want to reschedule my team meeting
- I want to cancel my team meeting
- What does my schedule look like today (or next Monday)?

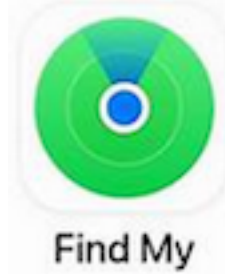
As you can see, Calendar is a much more complicated app than just scheduling one event at a time.

The video has many more tips that make your Calendar a multi-task app by using Notes, email, file attachments, et al. The later part of this YouTube video relates to iOS 16 tips, the latest update for iPhone.



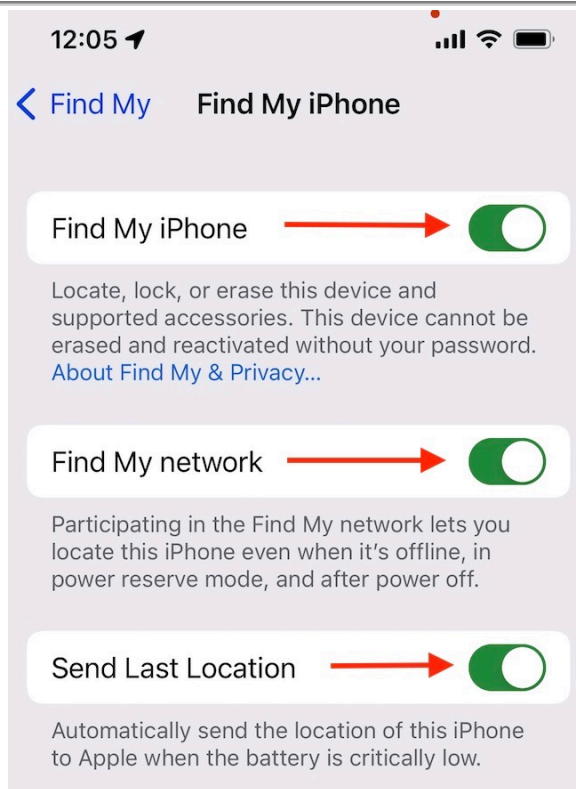
## TIPS FOR USING "FIND MY"

You may not have all the help in finding your iPhone actually turned on in settings. You can get help finding your iPhone, iPad, iPod touch, Apple Watch, Mac, AirPods, or AirTag right in the Find My app—even if your missing devices are offline.



Go to System Preferences in Settings and click on your Apple ID at the top. This will move you to next page where you will see logo for "Find My." Click on arrow to next page to see "Find My iPhone" and an option to turn it on. Click on that, and the next page will give you three more choices:

- Find My Phone – Locate, lock, or erase this device. Toggle on.
- Find My Network – Participating in the Find My Network lets you locate this iPhone even when it's offline, in power reserve mode, and after power off. Toggle on.
- Send Last Location – Automatically send the location of this iPhone to Apple when the battery is critically low. Toggle On.
